TOWN NEWS

VOLUNTEERS NEEDED FOR TOWN OF BRINY BREEZES The Town's Mayor Jack Lee stepped down unexpectedly October 1st, so there is an opening to fill the unexpired remainder of the term through March 2018. The Town Council may appoint a replacement at an upcoming Town Council meeting. To qualify for the position of mayor, an individual must be a registered voter in the Town of Briny Breezes. Interested individuals should bring their voter registration card to Town Hall.

There is an opening for a volunteer on our Planning & Zoning board. The P&Z Board is responsible for recommendations about the Town's comprehensive plan and the Town's land development code. The P&Z Board meets on an as-needed basis to make recommendations to the Town Council; they do not meet regularly every month. The only requirement for P&Z board members is to be either a shareholder in Briny Breezes Inc. or a resident. Volunteers should be in Briny Breezes a good part of the year, but do not need to live here full time or be homesteaded and do not have to be registered to vote in Briny Breezes. Individuals interested in being appointed to the P&Z openings should bring proof of residency or ownership to Town Hall.

MANAGER NEWS

CHARGE CARD PAYMENTS At the budget meeting on October 7th, it was voted by the Board not to accept credit card payments, due to the large fees incurred with them.

OFFICE LUNCH HOURS: Beginning in November, we will be adjusting lunch hours for the office staff. Christy: 11:30am-Noon; Sharon: 12:00-12:45pm; Cindy: 1-1:45pm. There will be times when emergencies come up but we will be adhering to this as much as possible.

UNIT REPAIRS: The corporation is asking all unit owners who experienced damage from Hurricane Irma to please complete repairs by December 1st. Thank you.

BULLPEN/RV INCREASE At the 4/12/17 board mtg, it was decided to increase the rates of the Bullpen, effective immediately. \$30 per day (+ tax) for stockholders and \$60 per day (+ tax) for non-residents. A 3 day deposit will be required in advance, when you reserve. This deposit will be NON-REFUNDABLE. Thank you for your cooperation.

MARINA INCREASE: At the 4/12/17 meeting, it was decided to increase Marina slip rentals, effective 10/1/2017, 5% for non stockholders.
