## RESPONSE TO FOUNTAIN QUESTION RAISED AT BOD GENERAL MEETING -

**Background:** Five years ago the Landscape & Beautification Committee was given the task of repairing/renovating the 50 year old fountain WITHOUT expense to the corporation. After almost a year of research which included input from stockholders, our maintenance staff, businessmen and fountain people the committee proposed to the Briny BOD a plan.

The plan included keeping the size, scale and footprint the same but two major changes would include restoring a sculpture feature and brick paver parking surface around the lower planter ring. Funding of the improvements would be accomplished through the sale of memory bricks. Changing the road surface (from asphalt to pavers) considered a material change would require approval of stockholders. \* Please vote YES on ballot #2 next month.

**Suggested Design:** Our research shows that there were multiple changes over the years, including at one point water lily plants, live koi fish, and 5 bronze dolphins in the lower pool.

a) The committee suggested to the BOD adding a Briny Sailfish style sculpture in the upper water basin. b) that Funding of the improvements would be accomplished through the sale of memory bricks. c) Pavers to be 'Road Grade' manufactured for heavy vehicle traffic yet safe for pedestrian, wheelchair and walker traffic. d) The paver ring (est.10' Diameter from fountain) will not reduce golf cart parking capacity but at the suggestion of a paver installer actually increase parking capacity by possible including an angled starburst pattern. e) Color has not been decided. f) the artist rendering is exactly that - an artist's rendering. It represents a concept or vision of a paver ring with sailfish sculpture. \* Once Stockholders approve moving forward with the renovation, a contractor will be consulted and specific details forwarded to BOD for input. The L&B Committee is an advisory group only. They research and filter stockholders ideas and request. Final approval on such things as paver colors or sculpture will come from our BOD.
