TOWN NEWS VOLUNTEERS NEEDED FOR TOWN OF BRINY BREEZES The Town's Mayor Jack Lee stepped down unexpectedly October 1st, so there is an opening to fill the unexpired remainder of the term through March 2018. The Town Council may appoint a replacement at an upcoming Town Council meeting. To qualify for the position of mayor, an individual must be a registered voter in the Town of Briny Breezes. Interested individuals should bring their voter registration card to Town Hall. There is an opening for a volunteer on our Planning & Zoning board. The P&Z Board is responsible for recommendations about the Town's comprehensive plan and the Town's land development code. The P&Z Board meets on an as-needed basis to make recommendations to the Town Council; they do not meet regularly every month. The only requirement for P&Z board members is to be either a shareholder in Briny Breezes Inc. or a resident. Volunteers should be in Briny Breezes a good part of the year, but do not need to live here full time or be homesteaded and do not have to be registered to vote in Briny Breezes. Individuals interested in being appointed to the P&Z openings should bring proof of residency or ownership to Town Hall.
