Rule B. Occupancy /Lots and Looks

8. Condition of Lots- All lots and mobile homes must be kept in acceptable and safe condition. In the case of neglect of lessee to maintain his lot and mobile home in acceptable condition, the management, after due notice and in accordance with the Violation and Fining Procedure in Appendix I, may put lot and mobile home in acceptable condition, charging expense of such to lessee.

Units must be free from mold, mildew, and algae

Units must have no peeling or chipping of paint

Units must have no rusty nails, screws or fasteners

Units must have no machinery, tools, or supplies visible around the exterior of units except during the time they are being used at that unit.

Units must have no ripped and dangling screens; broken, loose glass; or awnings, shutters, or gutters improperly attached to the unit.

TOWN NEWS - BUILDING PERMITS – FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

Q: What requires a building permit and why?

A: Most major work in our home requires a permit; minor home repairs do not require a permit. If you have questions whether you need a permit or not, ask at Briny Town Hall, 272-5495. Please know it is not the Corporation or the Town mandating this; we must follow the State of Florida Building code. The building code is volumes so we are happy to try to answer your questions or put you in touch with the Building Official.

Building permits and inspections are done to **keep communities safe**. For example, **electrical work done incorrectly is a fire hazard**. The homes in Briny Breezes are very close together; if you or a neighbor has electrical work done without a permit and inspection, you are putting yourself and the Community at risk of fire.

Also any work done in the home by **taking walls out, putting in floors, doors and windows, or roof work is a risk for collapse**.

Please know all the above is to keep everyone in Briny Breezes safe. You may do the work or have a helper, but you still need to get a permit and have the work inspected. Any work done without a required permit is subject to fines, in addition to the permit fees. There could also be a legal penalty as well depending on the violation. It costs much less to get a permit than to pay any fines and penalties.

Q: Should I do anything if my neighbor is doing work without a permit?

A: If you see a neighbor doing work, such as building a deck or flooring, installing a water heater, or electrical, or if you see construction debris put out for trash collection, and there is no white permit card in the window, please call the building official at 561-436-8732. He will know if he gave verbal approval or if there was no permit application.

Q: Isn't it cheaper to hire a handyman without a permit?

A: Yes it may be. There is not a requirement to hire a licensed contractor if you, as a homeowner, want to act as your own contractor and hire a handyman to help. Any homeowner can work on the home they live in, but they still need to obtain a permit. We have many talented and knowledgeable homeowners and handymen in Briny Breezes. Just make sure you obtain any permit(s) necessary and have the work inspected.
