RULE OF THE WEEK

Rule D. Vehicles and Parking

GOLF CARTS: (a.) A golf cart driver must be at least 16 years of age **and** be licensed drivers. (b.) Golf carts must be equipped with headlights, rear reflectors and a horn. (d.) Golf carts may be parked on common areas intermittently (defined as 4 hours or less) or when attending a Briny function. Golf carts cannot be parked on common areas overnight. There must be room to park a golf cart on the user's lot. (f.) All golf cart drivers are to follow the general rules of the road: (i.) follow one-way street signs; (ii.) adhere to speed limit (iii.) use arm signals to turn.
