## RULE OF THE WEEK

Rule B.5. d. Landscaping on individual stockholder's assigned lots is the financial responsibility of each stockholder. This includes planting of shrubs, trees, flowers and lawns and the cost of removal of such items and includes tree trimming beyond the capability of normal ground level trimming. Management has the authority to remove or trim any trees or other plantings that may eventually reach a size or height that blocks the view or restricts the free circulation of light and air or passage. All shrubbery on streets must be kept trimmed back to a minimum of six (6) inches from the pavement. No trees or shrubs are allowed to be touching adjacent units. Any trimming or removal required to be accomplished by Park personnel will be charged to that individual stockholder. No trees are to be planted or removed without Board approval.

## **SIGN UP FOR EMERGENCY ALERTS**

Police Captain Christopher Yannuzzi announced at the Town Council meeting that residents can sign up to receive emergency alerts specific to Briny Breezes by using the web site [www.readyabc.org](http://www.readyabc.org). Once on that web site, it will allow anyone to create an account and choose to be contacted by text message, mobile phone, home phone, or email. A user can also select which alerts to receive, for example, hurricane watch, hurricane warning, tornado watch, tornado warning, thunderstorms, and/or floods, etc. Town Council and the Corporate Office encourage all residents to sign up so that they are notified immediately of any severe weather or emergency situations.

## **How to Avoid Water Heater Explosions**

Did you know that a water heater incorrectly installed or in disrepair can become a bomb/water rocket? This isn't just science fiction. Water heaters have been known to explode when not maintained. Myth Busters has proven it (watch the video at <https://www.youtube.com/>

What happens inside your water is that as water is heated, pressure builds inside the tank. Normally, your water heater shuts off or releases the built-up pressure through a safety valve. However if these safety mechanisms fail, the pressure can mount until the tank eventually gives way.

Obviously, even a small explosion in your home caused by a water heater can create thousands of dollars in injury and damage to your home and your neighbors'. However, these dangerous situations can be easily prevented with just some [regular maintenance](#).

Here are the top tips for avoiding water heater explosions in your home:

Leave repairs & installations to professionals – You may be tempted to install or [repair your water heater](#) yourself to save a few bucks. However, even if your water heater doesn't explode, improper installation can cause many other costly problems, as well. Your water heater installation should be inspected by a licensed building inspector.

Inspect your T&P valve – Traditional storage tank style water heaters have a T&P (temperature and pressure) valve that releases excess pressure and keeps your water heater from exploding. Test it regularly – it should release some water when you flip the lever and then close tightly back into place. Due to the relatively low cost of safety valves, it is recommended that a defective valve be replaced with a new valve if the valve does not open easily or close tightly.

Lower the temperature – Your water heater's temperature should be set between 120-130° F. Anything higher can cause scalding burns and damage your water heater.

Get an annual water heater tune-up – A professional [plumber](#) can inspect your water heater to make sure your water heater's safety mechanisms are working properly.
