BRINY BAZAAR CHARITY Sea Turtle Adventures is a new 401 3(c) charity that we as a community supported this year through the Bazaar Charity donations. As part of their mission they do educational outreach. The Briny community was pleased to invite them to present to us this past Thursday April 20, 2017. Jackie Kingston, the president of the not for profit and a marine biologist, shared with us lots of information and pictures about the 5 different species of sea turtles that swim in our waters focusing on the 3 that actually nest on our beaches, Leatherback, Green and Loggerhead. Sea Turtle Adventures is comprised of just 6 volunteers who monitor a 3-mile stretch of beach that runs south of Palm Beach south through Gulf Stream. Not only do they mark the nests as they are found each morning but also collect and report the data to a larger state-wide database. They have been doing this for 10+ years. For the past 3 or so seasons, they have located and marked just about a1000 nests within this 3 mile stretch. At the close of the presentation, Jackie donated to the Charity Bazaar's Raffle, a framed photo of a sea turtle taken by one of the volunteers and a professional photographer. SIGN UP FOR EMERGENCY ALERTS

Police Captain Christopher Yannuzzi announced at the Town Council meeting that residents can sign up to receive emergency alerts specific to Briny Breezes by using the web site www.readyabc.org. Once on that web site, it will allow anyone to create an account and choose to be contacted by text message, mobile phone, home phone, or email. A user can also select which alerts to receive, for example, hurricane watch, hurricane warning, tornado watch, tornado warning, thunderstorms, and/or floods, etc. Town Council and the Corporate Office encourage all residents to sign up so that they are notified immediately of any severe weather or emergency situations.

May is Building Safety Month

Florida is a preferred global destination. It offers residents and visitors a sunny climate, beautiful beaches, and places to see and be seen. It’s a perfect place to live, take a vacation, or retire when the time is right.

But Florida is also at risk for natural disasters. Flooding, hail, hurricanes, tornadoes, and wildfires happen here. That’s why Florida leaders have put one of the nation’s most effective building code systems in place. Thanks to decades of dedication, Florida codes not only ensure construction of safe and strong buildings, but ensure that families can enjoy the latest innovations in energy efficiency, durability, and sustainability too.

Most Floridians understand the difference that modern building codes have made since Hurricane Andrew in 1992 – especially when buildings and homes survived the deadly, back-to-back hurricanes in 2004 and 2005.

Beyond safety and performance, buildings constructed after the advent of new codes qualify for fire, flood, and wind insurance discounts. The savings are real. Consider flood insurance, a necessary expense for most Floridians. Thanks to model codes, 230 communities qualify for discounts of 5% and up, cumulatively saving more than \$195 million every year. This puts money back in the budget for families and businesses alike.

In May, the International Code Council, building and fire code officials, and other partners will commemorate Building Safety Month. At that time, Florida will be recognized as a national leader in the application of modern building codes on behalf of its citizens, communities, and future generations. Florida leaders are to be congratulated for serving as the standard bearers for safety. It not only preserves our way of life, but protects paradise too.

MANAGER NEWS

BULLPEN/RV INCREASE

At our last board meeting, April 12, 2017, it was decided to increase the rates of the Bullpen, effective immediately. \$30 per day (+ tax) for stockholders and \$60 per day (+ tax) for non-residents. A 3 day deposit will be required in advance, when you reserve. This deposit will be NON-REFUNDABLE. Thank you for your cooperation.

MARINA INCREASE It was also decided at 4/12/17 meeting to increase Marina slip rentals, effective 10/1/2017, 5% for non stockholders.

WHEN CLOSING YOUR UNIT: Remove all loose items and place inside home (if two strong men can't lift it - leave it) Install and lower hurricane shutters, lock all doors.

EVERYONE should have their unit number visible on their mobile home. It should be reflective so that it can be seen at night, in case of emergencies.

TELEPHONE NUMBERS: We are putting together a ‘phone blast’ for emergencies. If you have a new cell number that we don’t have, please let the office know. Thank you.

OCEAN AVENUE BRIDGE WORK DETAILS The work is scheduled to begin on Monday, 4/24/17 and will last 120 days. There will be daily lane closures of one lane, depending on which side of the bridge they are working on. Work will be Mondays-Saturdays from 0800-1600hrs.

EXCEPTION: There will be a period of 6-10 days when the bridge will be closed at night and in an open position so that workers can sandblast and paint certain joints. Specific dates for this closure will be announced later; to include the installation of proper Detour signage.

Because flagmen will be used on both sides of the bridge throughout the duration of the project, responding Emergency Vehicles should be able to continue to utilize the bridge. However, response times will be impacted because of the traffic/bridge closure/workers presence/etc. It is recommended that Communications notify the Bridge Tender whenever a call for service will require use of the bridge.

All of the above work is weather permitting.
