All shareholders who rent their units to tenants are encouraged to consider having liability insurance. Policy premiums from the above sources ranged from \$130-\$425 annually, depending on coverage levels. The committee was also told by some shareholders that they have insurance on property in other states and are able to add coverage to that policy for their Briny Breezes' property. Not all insurers can do this if they are not licensed for Florida. If you have any questions, you can contact your insurance agent or one of the sources listed above.

HURRAY! The fountain was finally approved after 3 years. Making a handsome entryway to Briny will improve the image of our park. We will all benefit. We plan on accomplishing this remodel with funds collected by voluntary contributions purchasing pavers. There will be two sizes available – a standard brick size 4x8 that can be engraved, up to 3 lines maximum, with up to 20 characters per line for \$100 each. We have a larger size available which is 8x8. This can accommodate 6 lines with 20 characters per line, available for \$250 each. We have collected half of the funds but need to get our fundraising going to be able to start this project in the summer. It will be a monument to all those who love Briny. Suggestions for engraving will follow. Forms are available in the office lobby.
