PRESIDENTS REPORT

I hope everyone had a great Thanksgiving. Heard the community gathering was nothing less than spectacular. I want to thank everyone who came to our first regular meeting of the season last Wednesday November 14th. It was a nice turnout and your Board appreciates your interest. Many updates were provided, as the off-season was a very busy time. We are still finishing up damage from Hurricane Irma better than a year ago with repair and painting of the upper parts of the Ocean Club House. Approval was given to get this done!

Golf carts!!! The Town has a document that highlights the American Disability Act (ADA) provisions that will allow many of us to continue to use golf carts as we have always done. Get this from the Town Hall if you are interested in the specifics. Chief Yanuzzi said the police are not looking to enforcement but rather compliance. This means if you do not meet the criteria set forth in the ADA provisions then you will need to consider your options. Recall also that Briny has rules in place for the operation of a golf cart. To begin each and every golf cart must be registered in the office, have a decal affixed to prove this and have current insurance. This is done annually. While we do not at this time require an inspection SAFETY is critical to all of us. Please if you think your golf cart is not running correctly have it checked out. Even if you see nothing particularly wrong, and you have not had it serviced in years, have it checked out. An unusual odor could be a leaky battery, brakes that require a long distance to work- yes could be that your brakes are faulty. Let's not have fires or accidents that can be easily avoided. Of course, golf carts must follow the rules of the roads. We often see what appears to be children driving golf carts. The rule is clear: "A golf cart driver must be at least 16 years of age and a licensed driver". (D. 1.Golf Carts.)

HISTORICAL PRESERVATION COMMITTEE

‘WWII AFFECTED OCEAN RIDGE’ February 2000 Ocean Ridge Reporter

World War II affected Ocean Ridge. South Florida was affected more than any place else in the continental US. There was a major shipping lane within a few miles off the coast and ships were torpedoed regularly by German submarines. It is said that they were so close you could hear the subs charging their batteries. In 1942 twenty four ships sank off Florida, seven were torpedoed off Palm Beach County, including a British tanker which was sunk directly off the Inlet and 9 crew members died. The Coast Guard stationed a boat at the Inlet and members of the Coast Guard rode the beach on horseback and walked the area with guard dogs as Germans were said to have come ashore for sabotage purposes. Residents would go to the beach to see the smoking ships. They could feel the heat from the flames which lit up the sky. An Ordinance #53 was adopted in February 1942 ‘providing for blackouts and other means of protection against attacks upon this municipality by enemies of the US and their agents; providing the powers, duties and obligations of municipal officers, agents and other employees during blackouts making all air raid wardens and other agents and appointees of the state and county defense councils ex-officio municipal officers and agents...’ During World War II no one was allowed on the beach after dark, and a blackout was in effect restricting street lights, house lighting and car headlights. Floridians were terrified and lived in constant fear also enduring tough rationing. During 1942-1945 military bases and military personnel filled Florida. Palm Beach International Airport was then Morrison Field, an Army Air field and Boca Raton had a radar training field for Army Air Corps. The Breakers Hotel in Palm Beach became an army hospital. After the war there was an influx of veterans and with military dollars a new era of progress began.

When you reinstate the services you will be refunded for your Briny bulk TV only.

You must call the Bulk Center to reinstate or suspend services: 1-866-299-6824. When calling you will need your 9 digit account number. The Bulk Center is open 8am -8pm, closed on weekends. If you call on the weekends it will forward you to a regular customer service department. They are not the correct department to handle your request. Please call the Bulk Center Number listed above Monday-Friday.

For Repair or Technical Support please call [1-800-288-2020](tel:1-800-288-2020). Please note that a customer **must** call repair for a Technician to come to the home. A Technician must receive a repair ticket number that provides a Technician with clearance to allow him/her to come into a Customer’s Home.
