I learned several new things as well as reminded of several others. As a Cooperative we will need to tweak some of our practices- nothing outrageous. Overall we are good shape as it pertains to the statute. During the session I was reminded that we need to shore-up our enforcement of our other governing documents. Consider this a work in progress.

As the season continues, focus on the different projects will change. We expect the Flamingo/Lark Road project to be finished in the next couple of weeks. We have met with the contractors and believe we have resolved or at least understand some of the problem areas. The Fountain continues to show progress. We have met with a focus group relative to the South Storage lot. It needs maintenance and we have worked out a schedule to get this done. You will see more about this shortly.

South Storage area needs major maintenance. All renters in the South Storage Lot will be asked to move their trailers, cars, boats, RVs, cars out of the South lot between, December 1-10th. We will temporarily have you place them in District 5. The area needs to be properly graded and have some fill installed. Then the lots will be numbered and spaces marked. The storage contract will be enforced only allowing 1 space per share holder.

COMMUNITY POLICE ACADEMY

The Boynton Beach Police Department is now accepting applications for the 40th class of the Community Police Academy, which begins Wednesday, January 9, 2019.

Classes will be held from 6:30 p.m. to 9:30 p.m. Wednesdays for nine consecutive weeks at Fire Station 5, 2080 High Ridge Road, Boynton Beach. The program is free and open to residents and business leaders.

The program, taught by police officers, aims to educate participants about police practices and the legal system as it pertains to police work. The goal is to foster a deeper understanding of the police department through education and enhance community support of the officers.

Topics include: SWAT, K-9, Investigative Services, Crime Scene Unit, Traffic, community policing, crime prevention and the training and recruiting process. Some classes will include demonstrations by specialized units. Participants will also be able to ride-along with officers.
