TOWN NEWS REQUEST FOR PROPOSALS -- BOOKKEEPER

The Town of Briny Breezes is accepting proposals for a one-year contract with an independent contractor for bookkeeping services for the town. The bookkeeping work to be performed includes, but is not limited to, reconciliation of bank accounts, preparation of monthly budget reports, preparation of the annual town budget, submission of the annual TRIM notice, and other government filings as required, assistance in meeting the requirements of the town's external auditors during the annual independent audit, as well as any routine or special audits conducted by the Palm Beach County Inspector General or other governmental authorities, and preparation of financial reports and filings as required by Palm Beach County, the State of Florida, the federal government, and other governmental agencies.

The Town shall provide the independent contractor with a computer and designated software at the Town's own expense. The bookkeeping contract is anticipated to range from 4 to 15 hours per month, with flexible workdays; additional hours necessary during budget preparation/filing and audit.

Proposal responses should include the proposed hourly rate, and should describe experience and knowledge with QuickBooks, Excel experience, and experience and knowledge of municipal bookkeeping. If you call on the weekends it will forward you to a regular customer service department. They are not the correct department to handle your request.
