TOWN NEWS Sea Turtle Nesting Season Began March 1st

Florida's beaches are important nesting areas for sea turtles, and the sand dunes are home to many unique plants and animals.

Please help protect Florida's sea turtles, other wildlife and the coastal habitats upon which they depend. The sea turtle nesting season in Florida runs from March through October on the Atlantic coast. During the sea turtle season, please remember a few simple things to help protect these magnificent creatures and their habitat:

- It is against the law to touch or disturb nesting sea turtles, hatchlings, or their nests. Sea turtles are protected by both the Federal Endangered Species Act and the Florida Marine Protection Act.
- **If you see an injured or dead sea turtle, call the Florida Fish and Wildlife Conservation Commission 1-888-404-FWCC (3922) or *FWC from your cell phone.** Please be prepared to answer the following questions: What is the exact location of the animal? Is the turtle alive or dead? What is the approximate size of the turtle? Is the turtle marked with spray paint? (This indicates that the turtle has been documented.) What is the location of the closest access point to the turtle?
- Avoid going to the beach at night. If you must be on the beach at night, limit your walking and do not use flashlights or flash photography. The light may cause the female to abort the nesting process, or other sea turtles nearby may be discouraged from nesting if there are lights on the beach.
- Turn off outside patio lights and shield indoor lights from shining directly onto the beach by closing the drapes at night. Lights disturb nesting sea turtles and hatchlings. Please make sure your beachfront lights are in compliance with the law.
- While enjoying the beautiful beaches during the day, avoid disturbing marked sea turtle nests, and please take your trash with when you leave the beach.
- When crossing a dune, please use designated cross overs and walk ways. Do not climb over the dunes or disturb the dune vegetation.

Recently we became aware of this law from our Town Manager and thought it useful to pass on. Thank you Dale.

"The law requires any business in Palm Beach County selling merchandise or services to purchase a Business Tax Receipt. This includes one-person companies and home-based businesses. In addition to the Business Tax Receipt, businesses must also comply with any local license and ordinance requirements".

They would be then entitled to stay there for 2 weeks and the office will know you have given them permission. The guest badges are then the responsibility of the residents who are hosting them. Let them get the badges, leave the deposit and sign them in. We can be friendly, keep our community safe by being assured that a neighbor approved the use of their home and still follow the Rules. MANAGER NEWS

HOBBY CLUB PARKING Please obey the rules and do not park your golf cart or car in the no parking area at the corner of the Hobby Club and Banyan. It is very dangerous when cars come around that corner, especially if vehicles are in the no parking area and block the view.

CORPORATE KEYS: If you have a key to a corporate building, room etc. and you do not use that key regularly, please save the corporation some money and return it. Other resident volunteers have taken on responsibilities that you may have had previously, and a key would make it easier for them. Appreciate the help.

AT&T VACATION MODE – IMPORTANT: Vacation Hold can be activated for a minimum period of two months and a maximum period of nine months. When you voluntarily suspend your services, you are not able to suspend one service or reinstate only one service, it is all or nothing. **If you only have basic TV service that the Briny Breezes Bulk provides, you do not have to suspend.** If you are suspending your services you will be charged \$5.00 recurring monthly fee per service. When you reinstate the services you will be refunded for your Briny bulk TV only.

You must call the Bulk Center to reinstate or suspend services: 1-866-299-6824. When calling you will need your 9 digit account number. The Bulk Center is open 8am -8pm, closed on weekends. If you call on the weekends it will forward you to a regular customer service department. They are not the correct department to handle your request.
