NOTE FROM TOWN HALL

During April as Water Conservation Month, remember that basic water conservation practices include:

- Replacing aerators in kitchen and bathroom sinks with models rated for 1.5 gallons per minute or less
- Watering the lawn based on its actual needs and following the district's year-round landscape irrigation water conservation measures and/or local ordinances
- Installing low-flow appliances, such as a dishwasher
- Installing low-flow water fixtures, such as showerheads
- Implementing many more easy water conservation practices found in [Water Conservation Publications](#) from South Florida Water Management District

GUEST BADGES Remember to turn your guest badges in before you leave for the season otherwise your check will be deposited.

When calling you will need your 9 digit account number. The Bulk Center is open 8am -8pm, closed on weekends. If you call on the weekends it will forward you to a regular customer service department. They are not the correct department to handle your request. Please call the Bulk Center Number listed above Monday-Friday.

For **Repair or Technical Support** please call [1-800-288-2020](tel:1-800-288-2020). Please note that a customer **must** call repair for a Technician to come to the home. A Technician must receive a repair ticket number that provides a Technician with clearance to allow him/her to come into a Customer's Home.
