MANAGER NEWS

HOBBY CLUB PARKING Please obey the rules and do not park your golf cart or car in the no parking area at the corner of the Hobby Club and Banyan. It is very dangerous when cars come around that corner, especially if vehicles are in the no parking area and block the view.

INSPECTIONS During the past couple of weeks we have been riding throughout our community with the purpose of locating fences that do not belong and/or walk through areas that appear blocked. The good news is that we did not find too many problems. However, we do want to remind all of you that shrubs, bushes etc. on your property need to be trimmed. We saw (especially in District 1- sorry) lots of overgrown areas that block passage between and behind units. Please attend to these. By doing so now, helps us minimize the number of warning letters that need to be sent and/or followed up on. This gives us time to attend to other things-very much appreciated.

CORPORATE KEYS: If you have a key to a corporate building, room etc. and you do not use that key regularly, please save the corporation some money and return it. Other resident volunteers have taken on responsibilities that you may have had previously, and a key would make it easier for them. Appreciate the help.

NO PARKING There is no parking allowed under the Banyan trees on Banyan Blvd. unless there is a large function (e.g. shuffleboard tournament) that has been approved by the Manager.

UNIT NUMBERS – PLEASE make sure you have reflective unit numbers on your mobile home, visible for Police, Fire, EMS, etc. Thank you.

AT&T VACATION MODE – IMPORTANT: Vacation Hold can be activated for a minimum period of two months and a maximum period of nine months. When you voluntarily suspend your services, you are not able to suspend one service or reinstate only one service, it is all or nothing. If you only have basic TV service that the Briny Breezes Bulk provides, you do not have to suspend. If you are suspending your services you will be charged \$5.00 recurring monthly fee per service. When you reinstate the services you will be refunded for your Briny bulk TV only.

You must call the Bulk Center to reinstate or suspend services: 1-866-299-6824. When calling you will need your 9 digit account number. The Bulk Center is open 8am -8pm, closed on weekends. If you call on the weekends it will forward you to a regular customer service department. They are not the correct department to handle your request. Please call the Bulk Center Number listed above Monday-Friday.

Beginning of Briny Breezes

Briny Breezes Park began in 1934. The property was purchased by the writer's father in about the year 1921 as raw land. He cleared it and established Shore Acres Dairy with about 400 head of Jersey and Gurnsey cows.

In the Florida boom of 1924-1925 the land became far too 'valuable' to operate as a dairy and therefore the property was subdivided and in October 1925 was sold in building lots at a gross price of about \$1,800,000.00. The terms of the sale were 10% down and 10% quarterly and the purchases were of course highly speculative with the subsequent 'bust' following almost immediately.

For several years thereafter, life was mighty hard in these parts, I tell you. My father raised turkeys, strawberries and other produce to eke out a living while trying to straighten out titles and get the property in shape again in a legal sense.

In about the year 1934, a trailer drove by, turned around, stopped and made an inquiry as to whether it might be possible to park along the ocean front for a day or so. Permission was given and a day or so later another trailer happened by with the same result. From that incident, my father arrived at the conclusion that perhaps here was an opportunity to help out the problem of trying to make a living from the remains of a 'busted' subdivision development.

Ward B. Miller died in the fall of 1937 and this writer took over the operation from that time on, always improving and expanding as circumstances permitted. During the second World War, business was almost at the vanquishing point and this writer was obliged to take outside war work in order to supplement the limited income of the park and to meet expenses.

After the war, business boomed for a couple of years and then disaster struck in the nature of the 1947 hurricane which just about demolished Briny Breezes Park but fortunately we had just had two good seasons and enough money with which to clear the debris and rebuild.

From about 100 spaces in 1937, the park has expanded to 500 spaces at the present time.
