HISTORICAL PRESERVATION COMMITTEE

Steven Dennison is the son of Caryn and Bruce Dennison and grandson of Betty and Chuck Foland. He has spent many hours diving in front of Briny. Steve has found exposure of the Coquimbo, a ship that was wrecked in 1909. He has reported his findings to the Historical Dept. of Boynton Beach. The Coquimbo has been covered in sand, and Hurricane Sandy has exposed some of the wreck. He has found the bow, two masts and the stern of the ship.

The Coquimbo was carrying a cargo of long leaf pine lumber, loaded in Gulfstream, Miss., and bound for Europe when it struck the reef a half mile south of Ocean Avenue in early 1909. Again, no lives were lost, and the lumber was saved.

The crew of 15 spent two months in tents constructed from the masts while they waited for a tug to arrive from Key West. The tug did its best, but the Coquimbo resisted all efforts to dislodge it, and by May it had begun to break apart.

The cargo, however, washed ashore, to be stacked along the beach and finally auctioned. Some of that lumber became the first Boynton Beach Women's Club, constructed at the corner of Ocean Avenue and Southeast Fourth Street

NEWS FROM THE OFFICE

MAIL As you prepare to leave for the season, remember to notify your northern post office so that they stop forwarding your mail. As always, we will forward any first class mail that slips through.

GUEST BADGES Remember to turn your guest badges in before you leave for the season otherwise your check will be deposited.

HOBBY CLUB PARKING Please obey the rules and do not park your golf cart or car in the no parking area at the corner of the Hobby Club and Banyan. It is very dangerous when cars come around that corner, especially if vehicles are in the no parking area and block the view.

CORPORATE KEYS: If you have a key to a corporate building, room etc. and you do not use that key regularly, please save the corporation some money and return it. Other resident volunteers have taken on responsibilities that you may have had previously, and a key would make it easier for them. Appreciate the help.

NO PARKING There is no parking allowed under the Banyan trees on Banyan Blvd. unless there is a large function (e.g. shuffleboard tournament) that has been approved by the Manager.

AT&T VACATION MODE – IMPORTANT: Vacation Hold can be activated for a minimum period of two months and a maximum period of nine months. When you voluntarily suspend your services, you are not able to suspend one service or reinstate only one service, it is all or nothing. **If you only have basic TV service that the Briny Breezes Bulk provides, you do not have to suspend.** If you are suspending your services you will be charged \$5.00 recurring monthly fee per service. When you reinstate the services you will be refunded for your Briny bulk TV only.

You must call the Bulk Center to reinstate or suspend services: 1-866-299-6824. When calling you will need your 9 digit account number. The Bulk Center is open 8am -8pm, closed on weekends. If you call on the weekends it will forward you to a regular customer service department. They are not the correct department to handle your request. Please call the Bulk Center Number listed above Monday-Friday.

For **Repair or Technical Support** please call [1-800-288-2020](tel:1-800-288-2020). Please note that a customer **must** call repair for a Technician to come to the home. A Technician must receive a repair ticket number that provides a Technician with clearance to allow him/her to come into a Customer's Home.
