We should expect the 2019 season to be very heavy due to biennial nesting of the Green Sea Turtles. 2017 witnessed 150-200 Green nest along So. Ocean Ridge section verses 8 this past season. ## **FROM THE MAYOR**

### **Important Police Notice**

Last year it was reported that a possible squatter was living in District 4 and now there are reports of other squatters being in District 2

Capt. Chris Yannuzzi, Briny's liaison with Boynton Beach police, said two police reports were filed in early October concerning intruders on Juniper Drive. He added that a third suspicious incident was reported of another "possible intruder," also in District 2.

Capt. Yannuzzi said Briny could be a prime target for intruders. Because so many owners are winter residents, their homes could be vulnerable. General Manager Donna Coates pointed out that as many as 75 percent of Briny homes are vacant most of the summer.

Capt. Yannuzzi said the often repeated saying "If you see something, say something" is true in this instance. He urged residents to call the Boynton Beach police **immediately** after suspicions occur instead of waiting. It does not help police to be working with old details, he said

Mrs. Coates noted that residents might think of changing door locks if there is any thought that their homes are compromised. Numerous homes in Briny have had multiple owners or renters. This has resulted in an untold number of keys circulating.

Capt. Yannuzzi said residents arriving in Briny for the winter should pay attention to little details around their homes. Watch for bedding being different, towels folded differently, dishes rearranged or furniture moved slightly.

Mrs. Coates urged residents to call the Corporate Office if suspicious incidents occur.

All Briny residents, especially those Winter residents who are arriving south, are invited to a gathering at the Briny Ocean Club House on Tuesday, November 13.

The gathering is planned to give Briny residents information about the development that is underway in the lot south of Briny Breezes Boulevard.

Details of the development will be presented by the projects General Manager Karl Indivero.

The development calls for construction of 14 large town homes. Residents need to know about the heavy equipment that will be in and out of the project.

The meeting is scheduled from 5 to 7 p.m. in the Club House. Residents are invited to bring their favorite "happy hour" ingredients.

### **FROM THE DESK OF DONNA**

The season is upon us as Brinyites are returning like the swallows in San Juan Capistrano. It is so nice to meet and greet you as you come by the office or we meet on the street.

September 4<sup>th</sup> the Trident Road Crew began the Flamingo and Lark road projects. We have had some delays and YES the project is not complete as of this writing. Of course, rumors are very interesting but the facts are that The Trident Group did not quit. They needed to wait for the curbs to properly set up on Flamingo and were back for a while today to scrape and clean the roads. The cleaning of oil spills from the Concrete truck, the gutter machine and the tractors has been on the schedule of work. However, yesterday a resident called the Florida Department of Environmental Protection so this was confirmed by both myself and Trident. This was the second call, two weeks ago another Engineering Specialist from the FDEP came to Briny as a complaint was issued that we were polluting the waterway. The test was negative and the water is and was fine. The important thing is we checked out in both cases as we would not want to be in violation nor would the Licensed Contractors. Thank you for keeping us on our toes. The road leveling and compacting will be completed and I have been advised that the paving will begin on Lark and then on Flamingo. After the first layer of asphalt on Lark the D curbs will be installed. Some of the driveways on Lark will be lower than the elevation of the road. The goal was to restore the roads to where they were originally and pitch them towards the drainage. Some homeowners will need to make the adjustments to their driveways and I can put you in touch with Trident who have set up pricing for residents.

The Fountain as Ken touched on is still a work in progress, however we are much closer to completion. The plumbing and electrical inspections were approved this week and the open trenches closed up. Next will be the coping which is the beautiful Bullnose top of the fountain walls, then stucco, diamond bright, the installation of the sailfish. Finally the asphalt around the fountain will be removed and pavers installed. It has been a true labor of love from the L & B committee. Visionary Gary Gasco and Darlene Lozuaway, and the hard work of Ken Gross. I look forward with happy anticipation to see this work of art paid for by donations come to completion!

I will stop here as I will have the opportunity to add more next week now that the Bugle will be a weekly for the season. If you are back at Briny welcome home, if you are traveling to Briny soon safe travels and for you year round Brinyites "*there baaaacck*"

Just a few requests:

If you are having a major project done after your permit has been issued. PLEASE inform the office as to when the project is beginning. It is nice to be able to warn your neighbors and to prepare the roads. Work orders will be taken care in most cases. Some are calling the office a day or two after they are written. Some requests are not as important as others due to the nature of the work order. Some like worn out tile in a bath house cannot be attended to until the season ends.

As I have observed the Briny mail forwarding I find we are spending far too long each day forwarding mail. It will be a better use of Briny funds if everyone will properly have their mail forwarded to summer homes upon leaving next year. The post office only forwards for 6 weeks.

**LOOSE DEBRIS** Please do not leave lawn debris loose on the curb/street. This causes extra work for the crew to clean up. Put your debris in a can, box, or bag it. Thank you.

**RENTAL APPLICATIONS:** If you are an owner who will be renting your unit this season, don't forget to turn in your rental application as soon as possible. Don't wait until the last minute and risk inconveniencing or delaying arrival for your tenants or having to pay a fine for a late application. Turn in your application now!

**VISITORS** Anytime you have an overnight visitor, you need to fill out a form, in advance, to register your guest. There are short term guest forms for visitors staying 2 weeks or less, available on the [brinybreezes.us](http://brinybreezes.us) website, as well as other guest forms. Please refer to the Arrival & Departure section for guests and resident guests in your Briny Breezes Rules for more details. Guests staying 30 days or longer must have a background check.

**AT & T MPORTANT:** [Vacation Hold](#) can be activated for a minimum period of two months and a maximum period of nine months. When you voluntarily suspend your services, you are not able to suspend one service or reinstate only one service, it is all or nothing. **If you only have basic TV service that the Briny Breezes Bulk provides, you do not have to suspend.** If you are suspending your services you will be charged \$7.00 recurring monthly fee per service. When you reinstate the services you will be refunded for your Briny bulk TV only.

You must call the Bulk Center to reinstate or suspend services: 1-866-299-6824.

When calling you will need your 9 digit account number. The Bulk Center is open 8am -8pm, closed on weekends. If you call on the weekends it will forward you to a regular customer service department. They are not the correct department to handle your request. Please call the Bulk Center Number listed above Monday-Friday.

A Technician must receive a repair ticket number that provides a Technician with clearance to allow him/her to come into a Customer's Home.
