We have been hot and humid in Briny but hard at work! Here is a list of many of the projects underway or completed.


- The long awaited Fountain is at last underway. We had to jump through lots of hoops to get plans approved and this project properly lined up. We will keep you updated as the progress advances.
- Flamingo and Lark road work will begin on Tuesday September 4 this should be a fairly easy project, according to our contractor. We have conducted project meetings, gone to the town for permits, had the utility lines properly located as well as the sewer and water lines. We will communicate with the homeowners on these streets that have remained in residence.
- The trees have been trimmed all around the property with the precision of preferred vendor and friend of Briny Breezes “Billy Blackman” This included the overgrown area near and around the shuffleboard court.
- The shuffleboard court is looking wonderful. Andy and team replaced the roofing that was blown off by Irma last September. The weeds removed on the court, powerwashed and painting is now in progress.
- The lights in the pool are all working and this has made for pleasant evening swims.
- New Storage is completed and rental billing is going out this month.
- A new door to the laundry room has been ordered and will be installed.
- The restrooms in the community center are updated and looking very sharp.
- I have been working closely with the landscapers. It has been my experience with all landscapers and communities that no matter how good they are we always find fault. This is a huge property and every time we get good in one area of complaint there is a new complaint. I did go out for bids, but the price does not compare to what we have with the present company. ‘Briny Breezes Breaks Out to Celebrate Expansion’ – *PB Post December 1967*



Briny is on the move the signs said, and they proved it. Almost two dozen groups paraded across A1A and down to a grandstand set up in the middle of the mobile home community to dedicate the town’s new swimming pool and remodeled recreation building. ‘It’s the biggest progress we’ve made in one year, so we thought we’d throw everybody into the act.’ ‘Everybody’ included a Florida type Santa Claus clad in swim trunks and riding a motor scooter, fishermen carrying fresh caught fish off Briny’s beach, and a half dozen convict-garbed denizens of ‘Alcatraz’, the small rental section of the community.

The Seacrest High School band highlighted the cavalcade and representatives of the shuffleboard, cycling, hobby, card, trailer travel, wood workers, billiard and boat clubs paraded behind. The clubs put on skits in front of the residents, numbering slightly under 1,000 and from the enthusiasm of the players and audience, it was easy to see why ‘Briny is on the move’. ~ *Submitted by Dorothy McNeice*






