Rule Reminder : April 12, 2013 B. Occupancy / Lots and Looks,

Sec 5.,item d) states: No trees are to planted or removed without Board approval.

Planting / Tree Removal Applications are available in the office. It's a simple process and requires review by three signatures; Landscape Committee, Maintenance Staff and your local District Director.

**THE RULES COMMITTEE** would like to remind you of this rule:

B.5.(d) - All shrubbery on streets must be kept trimmed back to a minimum of 6 inches from the pavement. No trees or shrubs are allowed to be touching adjacent units. Any trimming or removal required to be accomplished by Park personnel will be charged to the individual stockholder.

**PLEASE REMEMBER, EVERYONE, TO TRIM YOUR SHRUBBERY AND PLANTINGS 6" BACK FROM THE PAVEMENT. THIS IS CRUCIAL TO PROVIDE ACCESS FOR EMERGENCY VEHICLES.**

Steve has found exposure of the Coquimbo, a ship that was wrecked in 1909. He has reported his findings to the Historical Dept. of Boynton Beach. The Coquimbo has been covered in sand, and Hurricane Sandy has exposed some of the wreck. He has found the bow, two masts and the stern of the ship.

The Coquimbo was carrying a cargo of long leaf pine lumber, loaded in Gulfstream, Miss., and bound for Europe when it struck the reef a half mile south of Ocean Avenue in early 1909. Again, no lives were lost, and the lumber was saved.

The crew of 15 spent two months in tents constructed from the masts while they waited for a tug to arrive from Key West. The tug did its best, but the Coquimbo resisted all efforts to dislodge it, and by May it had begun to break apart.

The cargo, however, washed ashore, to be stacked along the beach and finally auctioned. Some of that lumber became the first Boynton Beach Women's Club, constructed at the corner of Ocean Avenue and Southeast Fourth Stre
