There are thousands of Schulmerich installations all over the world including Arlington National Cemetery, West Point Military Academy, and Air Force Academy in Colorado. Briny's first Schulmerich Bell system was installed in 1974. At that time tapes and reels were manually used. A newer system was installed in 1994. In 1997 Barbara D'Errico became the trustee and she worked tirelessly for many years making sure the tapes were ready to be played at noon and 6pm.

Dear Briny Family and Friends,

Each year at this time, we ask you to open your hearts and your wallets to support some local organizations with a charitable (tax free) donation. It has been a longstanding tradition here at Briny to support local organizations that provide services to those less fortunate in the Boynton Beach area. This year, as in the past, they include:

The Community Caring Center, Boynton Beach. *“Our mission is to create a healthier community through nutrition education, social services and economic development programs.”* They have a meal program for the elderly, a Sr. Veggie mobile that delivers to seniors in the heart of Boynton, a food pantry, short- term financial assistance program to help with prescription drugs, and a faith in action program. It also supports the Secret Garden Café initiative and the Urban Farming project. They offer education and some training to help folks move towards independence.

The Soup Kitchen, Boynton Beach with a mission *“to feed the hungry and assist to keep families together by providing them nourishment, clothing and education.”* They are supported only through private donations.

Shop with a Cop, Boynton Beach Police provides children from local schools with a memorable Holiday experience while giving them an opportunity to enhance relationships with local police.

EMT’s, Boynton Beach. Their work here in our community is well known. Donations help with educational programs for the EMT’s themselves as well as for new equipment.

The Caridad Center, Boynton Beach; its mission is to *“upgrade the health, education and living standards of underserved children and families.”* They do this through more than 400 professional volunteers offering comprehensive medical, dental and vision care as well as other programs.

Sea Turtle Adventures, patrol the Briny Beach as well as others in the areas. Supports volunteers who mark and check the sea turtle nests and report the counts to the state. They work a 10 mile stretch that includes our beach. Additionally they offer educational programs throughout the county.

In addition to your generous monetary donations, all monies raised from **Bazaar Raffles** (supported by a variety of Briny clubs) goes to these groups.
