MOBILE HOME TIE DOWN PROGRAM

We are encouraging all unit owners to sign up for the FREE Mobile Home Tie Down program. The program is sponsored by the State of Florida and is paid for through grant funds that are available in limited amount each year. We applied to the program in 2014 and have been on a waiting list ever since. Finally, after 5 years, we found out last week that we have been approved. THERE IS NO COST TO HOMEOWNERS.

We all love living by the ocean, but the salt air and water can easily corrode the tie downs and anchors on our homes. This program will enhance the tie-downs on our homes, especially homes installed years ago before current requirements were put in place. For example, if a home was installed in the 70's it would have been installed according to code at that time. Code requirements were strengthened in the 90's after Hurricane Andrew and tie down materials now are much better.

The state has hired contractor Storm Ready Services to do the work in Briny Breezes.

Tie-Down Program Skirting Requirements

The State of Florida has allocated grant money through a contract with Tallahassee Community College to implement the Manufactured Home Tie-Down Enhancement Program. This program involves the enhancement of the tie-down and anchoring system of your home.

Skirting removal and re-installation on homes is now being offered in communities approved to participate in the Program. The following requirements will determine the eligibility of a home within an approved community.

1. All skirting must be easily removable and able to be re-installed with minimal effort, as determined by the Contractor.
2. Skirting types such as stacked block (non-mortared), vinyl panels, metal slats, lattice or any other types determined by the contractor as easily removable are eligible for removal as part of the Program.
3. Mortared block, vinyl lap siding to the ground, stucco or any other types determined by the contractor as not easily removable are non-eligible skirting types. Homes with these types of skirting (or any other types found to be not easily removed) will not be accepted into the Program unless the homeowner acknowledges in writing that he/she will take responsibility for the removal and re-installation of said skirting. Such written acknowledgement must be received by the Contractor and the skirting removed by the homeowner prior to commencement of work within the park.
4. All skirting must be free from damage before work is to take place. If the skirting has been removed by the Contractor and determined to be unable to be re-installed, then the repair and replacement of any skirting will be the sole responsibility of the homeowner.
5. Be prepared for a minimum two week timeline that the skirting could be off of your home. Timelines for skirting removal and re-installation will vary, depending on the number of eligible homes in the community.
6. The Contractor reserves the right not to remove and re-install any skirting that does not meet Program requirements. Tallahassee Community College and the State of Florida are not responsible for any damage caused by the removal and re-installation of the skirting.

This work is to be done under the State of Florida’s Residential Construction Mitigation Program (Program) and is to be paid in full from funds furnished under the Program. I (we) understand that no part of the cost of the enhancements will be paid by me (us). At my (our) individual inspection, I (we) will be informed as to whether removal and replacement of such things as shrubbery, awnings, patios, decks and removal of skirting that does not meet Program requirements (see skirting requirements) will be necessary on my (our) lot. If the before mentioned is necessary, I (we) understand that in order to still participate, I (we) am (are) solely responsible for this removal and replacement. I (we) also understand that the replacement of any skirting found to be damaged or defective during the Contractor’s removal process will be the sole responsibility of the homeowner. I (we) hereby release the Contractor, its employees, agents, and all other entities (as well as employees of those entities) connected to the Program (including the State of Florida and Tallahassee Community College), from any and all liability, loss, damage, or injury to any person or to the above property as a result of such work, including loss, damage or injury arising from windstorms, tornadoes, or hurricanes.

I (WE) UNDERSTAND THAT THIS PROGRAM INVOLVES ONLY THE ENHANCEMENT OF THE TIE- DOWN AND ANCHORING SYSTEM OF MY (OUR) HOME. **THE PROGRAM DOES NOT INTEND TO BRING EXISTING MOBILE HOMES UP TO CODE BUT TO MAKE THE HOME AS WIND RESISTANT AS FUNDING, PHYSICAL CHARACTERISTICS AND CONDITION OF PREMISES PERMIT.** I FURTHER UNDERSTAND THAT EVEN AFTER COMPLETION OF THIS WORK, I (WE) UNDERSTAND THAT I (WE) MUST STILL COMPLY WITH ALL STORM WARNINGS AND EMERGENCY OPERATION AND EVACUATION ORDERS ISSUED BY STATE OR LOCAL OFFICIALS, WEATHER SERVICES AND EMERGENCY OPERATIONS OFFICERS. (Fiscal Year 2017-2018)

I understand that similar work on a large number of mobile home units is contemplated under the Program and the work I have consented to may not be done at all if funds available under the Program are exhausted.

BEFORE LEAVING BRINY FOR THE SUMMER Please make sure to secure your home properly for hurricane season (June 1 to November 30). All patio furniture, bicycles, BBQ's, hanging items, trash cans, hoses and any miscellaneous items must be removed from the outside of units. It is not recommended to store BBQ propane tanks in or under your units. If you have a shed or Large LP gas tanks, they must be tied down securely.

Plants and Bushes: Stockholders are responsible for keeping their plants trimmed and areas weeded during the summer. All plants must be trimmed back away from the streets. Before you leave, please make arrangements to have someone take care of your landscaping. Give the name and contact information of this person. If you do not have someone and we are forced to maintain your yard you will receive an invoice from Briny.

STEPS TO CLOSING MOBILE HOMES (Take pictures of your home and contents) #13 HAS BEEN CORRECTED – DO NOT REMOVE BATTERIES FROM YOUR SMOKE DETECTOR!

- 1) Forward mail and suspend newspaper delivery.
- 2) Give keys to your caretaker and the Briny Office. Give the office the caretakers name and contact information.
- 3) Fill out emergency contact information form and return to the Briny Office, notify the office when you are leaving.
- 4) Take one Briny ID Badge with you for re-entering Briny after hurricanes.
- 5) Replace air-conditioning filters, turn off hot water switch and breaker / drain hot water heater tank. (Continued on next page)
- 6) Empty food from the refrigerator/freezer, block the door open or leave running with water only inside and put vegetable oil in garbage disposal.
- 7) Put RV antifreeze in bottom of dishwasher, washing machine and all drains.
- 8) Disconnect cable and electric from TV's and unplug all electrical items except refrigerator if left running. Disconnect telephone and answering machine and remove batteries.
- 9) Set humidistat and thermostat - turn off electric breakers except for A/C (to prevent mold or mildew)
- 10) Put out new roach pills and powder under cabinets and drawers. Put out ant traps in kitchen.
- 11) Set out pans of kitty litter and charcoal.
- 12) Cover toilet and toilet tank with Saran Wrap to seal and clean out garbage can and place inside.
- 13) Remove batteries from TV remote, flashlights, calculator, radio.
- 14) Remove address books, phone books, cameras and important papers • Open all closet doors and drawers / leave clothes dryer sheets in all rooms.
- 15) Trim all bushes back - remove all seasonal flowers. Give the office a name for our yard person and contact number.
- 16) Turn off water to mobile home. Disconnect and put water hose and reel inside mobile.
- 17) Clean grill and place inside mobile home, clean rain gutters and check roof for leaks.
- 18) Anchor outside storage shed (use straps over top and around the shed). Put outside chairs inside mobile home, put flower pots under mobile home.
- 19) Remove all loose items and place inside home (if two strong men can't lift it - leave it) Install and lower hurricane shutters, lock all doors **3/25/2019 DC**

They're on the air and reporting live in Briny Breezes

Bryant Gumbel, Jane Pauley, look out! You're getting morning-TV competition

At 8 AM every weekday, the studio falls silent and the camera starts rolling. Television anchor Ron Heinlein looks up from his desk and says "Good Morning, Briny Breezes.

Heinlein and his co-anchor, "B" Rudderham, are the Bryant Gumbel and Jane Pauley of Briny Breezes. For the past six weeks, the two retired residents have been hosts of a half-hour show that is broadcast via closed cable TV throughout their mobile-home park.

But this isn't hard-hitting journalism, folks. The day's pool temperature leads the news.

Announcements, such as the date of the next bake sale or the high scores of the bowling league, follow. "Everything is impromptu," Heinlein said. "We don't really practice."

Despite its local flavor, the show, called "**BBC 8**" for Briny Breezes Cable, does have all the trappings of a local network television show.

It has a theme song, a logo and its newly built studio has two cameras, lights and monitors. They even have a cameraman and an engineer. "We have everything they've got in a professional studio," said the show's engineer, Charlie Stimets.

Stimets, Heinlein and cameraman **Jack Taylor** thought up the idea last year as a way to reach all the members of the mobile-home community, a close-knit group known for its activities and trips.

They started out with their own cameras and equipment, but contributions from Briny Breezes Inc. and residents enabled them to buy professional equipment, Heinlein said. "The money is going to good use," he said on the air last week after thanking the community for its contributions. "It's letting us expand. As you can see, we've come a long way."

The volunteers say they had no idea the hours they would have to put in to produce a half-hour of local news. "It's kind of a killer," Stimets said. "But the people enjoy it so much."

Rudderham, 70, lives in Halifax, Mass., six months of the year. She was a teacher for 32 years and did not have any experience in TV before starting at BBC-8

Like the anchors on NBC's Today, Rudderham and Heinlein conduct interviews. But their guests are not diplomats such as Henry Kissinger or entertainers such as Barbara Streisand.

Instead, they invite local residents and their guests to come on the show and tell stories or show off the results of their hobbies. "There is a never-ending list here of talent," Heinlein said. "I have no fear of ever running out of people."

Heinlein interviewed Don Amon, a resident who has become known around the park for his bird and animal wood carvings, despite the small audience-the show is broadcast only to the almost 600 trailers in the park-Amon admitted he was nervous.

"This isn't my bag. I can do this stuff," he said, pointing to his carvings, "but I don't know about television."

Heinlein says he thinks the show, which will go off the air on May 1 and return Oct. 1, reaches about 1000 people each morning.

"The old timers say this is the finest thing that has happened in Briny Breezes," Heinlein said. "It's bringing everyone together."
