FROM THE DESK OF DONNA This week I would like to address the process of violations and fining. A violation and fining appeal meeting was held on Tuesday morning in the community center. There were 3 Shareholders that received violations each affected Shareholder was given proper notice and consideration by the committee. This is not a pleasant job and I commend the volunteers that sit on this committee from each district. We have rules and they must be followed and enforced. All three of these violations dealt with the Rental Process.

I want to remind all Shareholders that if you plan on renting your homes next season follow the procedures. This is your responsibility. Pick up the rental packet from the office or online. Submit all properly executed paperwork at LEAST 30 days prior the start of the lease. Make sure your renter understands the EXACT start date of the lease agreement. If you have questions call or email the office. As my first year comes to completion the first of May, I have learned the rhythm of Briny Breezes, and understand most of the rules for the community. I will begin a process of sending out violation notices as they occur. We will call you and inform you of the violation giving you time to make corrections. Then a letter will be sent, and if the violation is not corrected by the date required, a violation fine will be sent to your Board of Directors for approval. Then there is the appeal hearing, heard by the committee. This is the part of my job that I do not like, but a necessary task.

In closing save this Manager the heart wrenching chore of violations. Clean up your yards, park properly, behave at the pool, keep your dogs on leashes and pick up after them. Wear your badges, register your guests and get their badges. Fill out all paperwork. Be mindful of your neighbors and if we all do our parts then violations may not be needed.

The Little City of Luxury Trailers

Briny Breezes is a small city of trailer homes where Cadillacs abound and yachts are tied up in the front yard. Its 1700 or so winter residents say that there is no other place like it and the visitor is quick to agree with them.

The waters of the blue Atlantic Ocean roll up on one side of the trailer park and the Inland Waterway flows past on the other. People from all over the U.S. and Canada call Briny Breezes their home during the winter months. They represent doctors, lawyers, clergymen, businessmen, artists, writers and those who have retired. Here for a few months, they leave behind the cares of business and home responsibilities in the north to enjoy 'trailer life'.

This includes a leisurely way of going from one day to the next – fishing before breakfast, swimming whenever they feel like it, playing a shuffleboard game or just visiting with other 'trailerites' whose backgrounds are of a wide variety.

There are people like Janet Folsom, who took home the top honor of the Boca Raton Art Show in February with one of her oil paintings. A small colony of artists has developed at Briny Breezes and among them are Frank C. Burritt, Marie Butts, Dorothy L. Gluek, Madeline Ives, Mildred Miller, Guy W. Phelps, Valida Robinson, who is instructor in water colors at the Park, R.R. Sheibenberger and Marie M. Zielinski.

These are only a few people at Briny Breezes, selected at random to give some idea of who spends the winter in the trailer park that like Topsy, just 'grew and grew'. ~ *Dorothy McNeice, February 2002*
