FROM THE PRESIDENT AND FROM THE DESK OF DONNA

March 5, 2019

Dear Shareholders,

The results of the votes as reported last week were incorrect. The tabulations were correct, however the pass mark applied was not, with the exception of the reduction in reserves which is a different pass mark. Here in Briny for most ballot items including a material alteration, 51% of the outstanding shares must be an affirmative, yes. This means that we need 8008.5 shares voted yes. We had **NO** resolution on the ballot that received that pass mark. We had a very low voting attendance and more than a thousand (1000) shares had to be "disregarded." This was needed because we received ballots without signatures affixed to the signature line, designated proxies who then did not show up at the meeting, ballots received without a proxy and without the shareholder in attendance at the meeting. The voting _commissioners did their best making sure that the amendment ballot w1:1s not in the Director's ballot box, tried to match a signed proxy with a signed ballot even if they arrived separately.

There are many restrictions placed on the voting process between State Statutes and then our own documents. Last year in spite of a much higher voter turn-out we experienced similar problems with the voting process. Several years ago a ballot item failed which attempted to change the process to reflect 51% or greater of the shares voted. It was defeated. We will work diligently to make the process as easy as possible going forward.

Director ballots are different and were not influenced in this process. Keith Harrah from District I won that election and Michael Weir, who was un-opposed will continue as a Director from District 4.

With sincere apologies for the confusion. Here are the results:

Ballot Item #4: Amend Section 7.80 to require a 3 year moratorium for new owners before sub- leasing Yes **5386** No's **2889**

Ballot Item #5: Shareholder's resolution re: the G24/25 retaining curb/wall
Yes 3918; No's 4054

SAINT PATRICK is considered the most influential Christian Missionary in history, (second only to the Apostle Paul). Patrick was born in Roman Britain in the late fourth century. When he was fourteen or so, he was captured by Irish pirates during a raiding party and taken to Ireland as a slave to herd and tend sheep. Patrick credits his miraculous escape and return to Britain after a vision from Christ. It was that strong faith and belief in forgiving others that lead him to return to Ireland to share the Gospel of Salvation to his former captors. According to Irish legend, Saint Patrick used the shamrock as a metaphor for the Holy Trinity when he was first introducing Christianity to Ireland.

IRISH FLAG contains three equal stripes - The **green** represents the native people of Ireland (most of whom are Roman Catholic). The **orange** color represents the British supporters of William of **Orange** who settled in Northern Ireland in the 17th century (most of whom are Protestant). White represents the hope for peace between them.

BEACH DUNE RESTORATION & FL DEP

* Please **DO NOT** cross over the wall or trample dune plants. **ALWAYS** use one of the 5 paths. Last June we met with FL DEP (Dept. of Environmental Protection) to review our on-going Dune Restoration Project. At their suggestion we have implemented curved beach access paths along with post & ropes. These winding paths are intended to alleviate sand drifting up on the park sidewalks. In the past we have attempted to use vegetation instead of beach fencing, but people continue to trample plants. The new post & ropes are considerably more attractive than the alternative Dune (snow drift style) Fence. You can help by politely saying something if someone walks across the dune.

HISTORICAL PRESERVATION COMMITTEE

The Day the President Came to Briny Breezes: Saturday, February 28, 1976 will long be remembered in Briny Breezes...waiting in the soaking rain for nearly two hours, some thousand Brinyites were overcome with relief when as the President arrived, the rain stopped, and President Ford emerged from his limousine. The President also seemed relieved as he chatted easily with our Mayor, Hugh David, and then with our new president, Don Redelings....Eager to show his appreciation to those in our community, he started along the long roped lines and shook the hands that were extended. Many were also surprised and pleased on the opposite side of A1A when he walked across the road to continue the handshaking. Although time and weather presented their problems, the Boating and Fishing Club, who had been appointed to take over decorations for the event, managed to put up red, white and blue bunting across the front of the drug store and our office and to install a canvas greeting sign...the decoration that caught the news media camera was a hastily put together large blue panel that in contrasting white letters, told the Briny story....'Florida's Smallest Municipality – BRINY BREEZES – No Bonds – No Mortgages – No Debt'. It will be remembered for all time by those who had participated...the day the President came to Briny. ~ *Written by Paul L. Folsom and Submitted by Dorothy McNeice*
