PRESIDENTS MESSAGE

So by now you all have received your annual meeting package and proxy/ballot for the 2016 Annual meeting. Many of you attended district meetings where the process and ballot items were discussed and others have contacted their district directors or Theresa with questions...

AS you know, signing your proxy, completing your ballot and turning it in on time are all VERY important to the process of our corporation annual meeting. We cannot conduct business without a quorum of the shareholders present or by proxy and we cannot make necessary changes to our by-laws or continue on the path of progress without your votes.

What is my point to all of this? We need you to participate and please don't wait till the last minute to return your proxy.

PLEASE avoid being influenced by negative antics and/or rumors.

- a. There is nothing illegal about the ballot or the process: the entire package was all reviewed and/or prepared by corporation attorneys.
- b. There is no requirement for a “secret ballot” or “secret voting” for anything on this ballot. Secret voting is only done for elections in contested races.
- c. There is nothing on the ballot asking you to approve a special assessment.
- d. The Board of Directors has approved all of the items on the ballot and recommends a YES vote for ALL ballot items.
- e. If someone is telling you to vote NO on a ballot item, please understand WHY you are voting NO and the consequences of your NO VOTE.
- f. There are VERY important items on this ballot.

PLEASE reach out to your district directors, Secretary Susan Brannen or our GM Theresa with any questions or concerns. **I will be voting YES!**
