2- pieces of YUPO large sheet 20x26 (you can use them whole or cut them in 1/2) (Hands in Delray has ordered 20 pieces for Briny (under Ginny Clarks Name. Call Dave To reserve.) about \$5.00 per sheet. You can use any weight of Yupo paper. YOU MAY ALSO USE:

And /or 1 sheet of Watercolor paper – cold or hot press – 1/2 or whole to try the spider web process.

And/or Canvas Board or Stretched canvas- to try spider web process

2 Foam core boards, same size as YUPO sheet. Each painting you create must have its own foam core backboard.

1 Large inexpensive 2 or 3in brush (home depot), To apply water. Spray water bottle

Image to paint over webbing background. Paper Towels. Plastic sheet to cover table

Inexpensive plastic gloves (some paint colors can stain hands) (dollar store)

Grubby clothes and or Apron. Spraying paint is messy sometimes.

NOTE FROM THE TOWN OF BRINY BREEZES

If you have an irrigation system on your lot, the South Florida Water Management District wants you to be familiar with the Year-Round Landscape Irrigation Rule. This rule limits landscape watering by an irrigation system to three days a week throughout Palm Beach County. No lawn and landscape irrigation should be done between 10:00 a.m. and 4:00 p.m. or at any time on Fridays. If your unit number ends in an odd number (1, 3, 5, 7, 9), do your watering on Monday, Wednesday, and Saturday. If your unit number ends in an even number (2, 4, 6, 8, 0), do your watering on Tuesday, Thursday, and Sunday. New plantings may be watered for the first 30 days every day before 10 a.m. or after 4:00 p.m. except Friday. No irrigation watering is allowed on Fridays. Watering your plantings by hand with a container or a hose with an automatic shut-off nozzle is allowed anytime. During rainy season, don't water on days that it rains. If you have any questions, call the South Florida Water Management District "Water Conservation Hotline" at [1-800-662-8876](tel:1-800-662-8876).

Sea Turtle Nesting Season in Florida runs from March through October on the Atlantic coast. During the sea turtle season, please remember a few simple things to help protect Florida's sea turtles and their habitat:

- It is against the law to touch or disturb nesting sea turtles, hatchlings, or their nests.
- Avoid going to the beach at night. If you must be on the beach at night, limit your walking and do not use flashlights or flash photography. The light may cause the female to abort the nesting process, or other sea turtles nearby may be discouraged from nesting if there are lights on the beach.
- Turn off outside patio lights and shield indoor lights from shining directly onto the beach by closing the drapes at night. Lights disturb nesting sea turtles and hatchlings. Please make sure your beachfront lights are in compliance with the law.
- While enjoying the beautiful beaches during the day, avoid disturbing marked sea turtle nests, and please take your trash with when you leave the beach.
- If you see an injured or dead sea turtle, call the Florida Fish and Wildlife Conservation Commission 1-888-404-FWCC (3922) or *FWC from your cell phone. Please be prepared to answer the following questions: What is the exact location of the animal? Is the turtle alive or dead? What is the approximate size of the turtle? Is the turtle marked with spray paint? (This indicates that the turtle has been documented.) What is the location of the closest access point to the turtle?
