The Day the President Came to Briny Breezes: Saturday, February 28, 1976 will long be remembered in Briny Breezes...waiting in the soaking rain for nearly two hours, some thousand Brinyites were overcome with relief when as the President arrived, the rain stopped, and President Ford emerged from his limousine. The President also seemed relieved as he chatted easily with our Mayor, Hugh David, and then with our new president, Don Redelings....Eager to show his appreciation to those in our community, he started along the long roped lines and shook the hands that were extended. Many were also surprised and pleased on the opposite side of A1A when he walked across the road to continue the handshaking. Although time and weather presented their problems, the Boating and Fishing Club, who had been appointed to take over decorations for the event, managed to put up red, white and blue bunting across the front of the drug store and our office and to install a canvas greeting sign....the decoration that caught the news media camera was a hastily put together large blue panel that in contrasting white letters, told the Briny story....'Florida's Smallest Municipality – BRINY BREEZES – No Bonds – No Mortgages – No Debt'. ## RULES & REMINDERS

### GUESTS

Guest must register in the office upon arrival. A non-photo guest badge is required with the fee paid at the office. Badges must be worn in the park & on the beach. Overnight guests may not exceed the "normal sleeping capacity of the unit". And guests are defined as those: who are not owners, approved renters or registered resident guests.

### ID BADGES

Badges are for the safety and security of all. Photo badges are issued to all stockholders, residents and renters. It's strongly recommended we wear these badges. Non-photo badges are available at the Office for guests. It's the Resident's responsibility to obtain these badges. These must be worn while guests are in the Park. A fee of \$25 is charged for each badge, which is refundable when guest badges are returned to the office. Guest badges are issued for a period of two-weeks. Extension of the two-week period will be granted one time upon request at the Office.

## **PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE**

We had a great turnout for our Annual Election. I thank each of you who attended and an extra thank you to those who sent their proxies in EARLY. We were able to start our meeting, with a quorum, without any delay. The participation levels were high and we passed 4 of our 5 by-law changes, with the 5<sup>th</sup> only 111 shares from passing. By the way, there were a bunch more YES votes for all of these items received a day or two LATE. Record #s of shares voted (11,495). You also successfully voted to waive full funding of reserves and mandatory retrofitting of fire sprinklers. I am so pleased at the high levels of participation!

THANK YOU to our 8 dedicated voting commissioners and Election Coordinator, Chuck Foland. This very complex election ran so smoothly. I know that we are all happy to have the annual meeting behind us (lots of paperwork) and ready to get back to work. We as a board will continue to build on recent successes and assist the General Manager and staff in continuing our movement into the future. Flooding, seawalls, parking, goals for short term and long term sustainability, upgrades and maintenance are on the top of everyone's list. Long range planning, and streamlining procedures and of course enforcing rules are hot topics as well. Communication and following guidelines and procedures will help facilitate successful change. I ask that we all take a hard look at our expectations and think about how we react to issues in the park. Are we reacting in a manner that will facilitate positive change or are we just spreading negativity? Are we providing solutions to our complaints or are we just complaining? Are we responding to rumor or are we verifying facts? Are we planning to be part of the solution or part of the problem?

Some other thoughts that I ask each of you to consider; your board members dedicate A LOT of time and energy into making Briny a safer, more enjoyable place for each of you. Consider thanking them instead of YELLING at them, especially during social events. Is it fair that your board members come to a social event but are bombarded with complaints or even worse, YELLED at? NO it is not. And YES this is happening. We should all have respect for each other. The board is elected, by you, to help facilitate the running of the corporation. No board member signs up to be yelled at, verbally abused or dis-respected. There is no reason for it. Now I am sure most of you are aware that this part of my message only goes out to a small handful of shareholders, but it has got to stop. Let's ALL be a little nicer to each other. Most of you are so gracious in your compliments, letters, emails and calls of appreciation, and for that, I THANK YOU!

Remember too that your office staff, maintenance staff, and general manager are here to run the park. They have long lists of responsibilities so I ask that you respect their time when you are interacting with them. Our staff is super friendly and they enjoy talking with each of you, but please be considerate of how much time you keep them from their regular responsibilities.
