Chicago Tribune – January 2, 1937 'Briny Breezes by the Sea for Trailers & Campers'

This 'anchorage for trailers and campers' offers advantage of former million dollar subdivision of forty acres. There are hundreds of yards of coral sand beach; groves of stately Coconut palm and Australian pine; splendid water systematically piped to all parts; pavements, sidewalks, electricity; flush toilets, shower baths, laundry, hot and cold water.

Shaded grassy camp sites of generous space offer quiet away from main highway; lulled by sea breakers, among murmuring pines. Bathe and fish; watch the sea and air liners sail by; enjoy the bracing balmy air; suntan in the sands or loll in the shade. This is one of the many trailer towns that have sprung up in Florida in the last two years. Families from the north are living there, paying \$3 a week to rent. It is 18 miles south of fashionable Palm Beach where the rich pay \$10-\$25 a day hotel rent to enjoy the same sunshine and surf. School bus stops at camp.
