## **HISTORICAL PRESERVATION COMMITTEE**

*Originally by Helen Prudhon – Sept. 2005 Bugle*

Do you know the following facts?

In 1957 Briny Breezes advertised in the Delray Beach Journal. In 1957-65 members of the Masonic order organized trailer Square Club No. 1, the first trailer chapter in the country. In 1958, a 34 man committee headed by a 12 man team, organized for the purpose of purchasing Briny Breezes.

In 1958 Palm Beachers were aghast at \$1.3 million being paid for a trailer park. In 1958-59 the general operation income was \$105,452 – anticipated income, \$89,500, 505 lots assessed for \$100 per lot membership. Real estate taxes were 80 cents per vote.

The park was rated as five star. 24 lots in Alcatraz, were for rent on an annual basis for \$32-\$35 per month. In 1959, Section 1 was improved at a cost of \$37,500. The maintenance building was located where the Community Center now stands – the corporation owned buildings and rented out the yacht basin, laundry, grocery, restaurant, drug store, beauty shop, boat storage, trailer storage and an awning factory. I will close with a positive note from a 1958 paper, ‘The buyers were mobile home owners and everybody in Palm Beach knows now, these are real solid people – monocles they don’t have, but who needs a monocle to see a million dollars’.
