The plant's association with [Christmas](#) began in 16th-century Mexico, where legend tells of a girl, commonly called Pepita or Maria, who was too poor to provide a gift for the celebration of [Jesus'](#) birthday and was inspired by an [angel](#) to gather weeds from the roadside and place them in front of the church altar. Crimson blossoms sprouted from the weeds and became beautiful poinsettias. The star-shaped leaf pattern is said to symbolize the [Star of Bethlehem](#), and the red color represents the [blood sacrifice](#) through the [crucifixion of Jesus](#). TOWN NEWS

RULES OF THE ROAD: Residents are reminded to follow one-way signs on all Briny Breezes' roads. Golf carts and bicycles, as well as cars and trucks, must obey one-way signs and speed limits. The Florida Department of Transportation has advised the town that we must educate our residents and enforce traffic laws to minimize the occurrence of driving the wrong way on local streets.

DISTRACTED PEDESTRIANS What happens when a distracted driver runs into a distracted pedestrian? No one wins! Stop in to Town Hall next to the beauty salon to pick up a cell phone screen cleaner to remind yourself not to be distracted while walking.

IRRIGATION If you have an irrigation system on your lot, the South Florida Water Management District wants you to be familiar with the Year-Round Landscape Irrigation Rule. This rule limits landscape watering by an irrigation system to three days a week throughout Palm Beach County. No lawn and landscape irrigation should be done between 10:00 a.m. and 4:00 p.m. or at any time on Fridays. If your unit number ends in an odd number (1, 3, 5, 7, 9), do your watering on Monday, Wednesday, and Saturday. If your unit number ends in an even number (2, 4, 6, 8, 0), do your watering on Tuesday, Thursday, and Sunday.

New plantings may be watered for the first 30 days every day before 10 a.m. or after 4:00 p.m. except Friday. No irrigation watering is allowed on Fridays. Watering your plantings by hand with a container or a hose with an automatic shut-off nozzle is allowed anytime. During rainy season, don't water on days that it rains.

DON'T FALL FOR THIS SCAM!

You may receive a phone call from a person who says they are a bank fraud investigator. They may say that your debit or credit card has been compromised. They may know your account number and even recent purchases you made, and ask you to confirm account information such as the PIN number. They assure you that you need a new safe card and that a bank employee will come to your home to collect the compromised card and replace it with a new card with a new chip. They may offer to take all your credit cards and get them protected against fraud.

DON'T FALL FOR IT! Don't let strangers into your home. A BANK EMPLOYEE WILL NEVER COME TO YOUR HOME. Hang up and call your bank yourself (look up the number; don't use re-dial) or go to a branch to check on your account. And call the police right away 561-732-8116 so that they can try to trace the crooks who do this!

AUDITORIUM RESERVATION REMINDER:

As many of you know, especially clubs and activities, reservations must be made in advance at the office for any event. The reason for this reminder is because the auditorium differs a little, when reserving other spaces.

The Auditorium is the only place of assembly that has an extra step in reserving.

1. Reserve Auditorium by going to office and complete the request as usual.
2. Return it to the office staff ASAP with all questions completed.
3. A form will be returned to you via interoffice mail, approving date and how many Fire watch people will be assigned to your event. If it is a recurring event it just needs the one form.

If these steps are not completed properly, you risk the chance of not getting a reservation & can be **problematic with the Boynton beach Fire Marshall's directions, which can close down the auditorium if we don't follow their directives.** Reports of use of the auditorium are all filed with the Boynton Fire Dept. Thank you so much for your understanding. The office staff can answer any questions if needed.

911 & NON EMERGENCY CALLS: When calling 9-1-1 or the non/emergency number, YOU MUST PROVIDE THE FULL STREET ADDRESS of the location of the issue, NOT the mailing address (5000 N Ocean Blvd) or their Unit letter/number. This will improve the response time of both Police and Fire/EMS. Thank you! * Also, the non-emergency number for Boynton Beach is (561) 732-8116.

HOLIDAY SAFETY TIPS

If you're shopping: Stay alert. Park in a well lighted space, be sure to lock the car, close windows and hide bags in trunk. Avoid carrying large amounts of cash; pay with check or credit card when possible. Deter pickpockets and purse snatchers, be careful with purses, put wallets inside pants pockets. Do not carry Social Security card or PIN numbers. When possible walk to your car with someone, especially after dark.

If a stranger comes to your door, beware: Criminals sometimes pose as couriers delivering gifts. It's not uncommon for people to take advantage of other's generosity during the holidays. Ask for identification, find out how the funds will be used. If you aren't satisfied, don't give. Help a charitable organization you know instead. Do your part to make the holidays a safe and happy time for everybody – except criminals!
