The Road to Little Dribbling: Adventures of an American in Britain by Bill Bryson. Twenty years ago, Bill Bryson went on a trip around Britain to discover and celebrate that green and pleasant land. The result was Notes from a Small Island, a true classic and one of the bestselling travel books ever written. Now he has traveled about Britain again, by bus and train and rental car and on foot, to see what has changed—and what hasn’t.

The First Time by Joy Fielding. An exquisitely tender and richly textured love story of astonishing emotional force.

Forsaken by Ross Howell Jr. (not in large print - last week’s note was in error). In April 1912 in Hampton, Virginia, white eighteen-year-old reporter Charles Mears covers his first murder case, a trial that roiled racial tensions. An uneducated African American girl, Virginia Christian, was tried for killing her white employer. Virgie died in the electric chair one day after her seventeenth birthday, the only female juvenile executed in Virginia history.

HISTORICAL PRESERVATION COMMITTEE

‘A Short History of the Town of Briny Breezes’ – by Jack Lee, Mayor

In the middle 50’s the Millers, who owned Briny, decided to sell to a developer. In 1958(?) a group from Briny came up with a deposit and the rest is history. However, in the early years Briny was in unincorporated Palm Beach County, which didn’t really want a trailer park between Ocean Ridge and Gulf Stream. It was difficult or in most cases impossible to obtain building permits. There was the threat of annexation and the threat of being lost to another developer. These issues led to the idea of forming our own town.

With the help of local politicians and the advocacy of the residents of Briny, we were incorporated into a town on March 9, 1963. Hugh David was our first Mayor and served in that position for almost 40 years. Briny was now its own entity. Briny was now independent from other towns and no longer in an unincorporated part of Palm Beach County. Briny could now control its property tax rate, issue building permits, and contract for police and fire protection. The Town of Briny could also receive revenue from tax sharing and other sources in order to offset the cost of safety services. During the time Hugh was Mayor, he spent many hours going to meetings and doing research to receive a grant to rid Briny of the septic system and install a sewage system that would be connected to the regional sewage system of Boynton and Delray. Another achievement for Briny’s progress during his administration was putting most of our electrical service underground.

Many people are confused about what the Town is. A lot of what the Town does is behind the scenes, but the Town is a very vital part of the whole picture of Briny. The Corporation and the Town are two different systems but vital to each other. Neither one would work well by itself. Your utilities, fire and police protection are here because of the Town. This year’s property tax millage rate reduction happened because of your town. Finally, the Town works closely with neighboring municipalities and governmental officials during states of emergencies to ensure that utilities such as electric and water are restored as soon as possible. ~ Submitted by Dorothy McNeice Feb. 2007
