## SABAL PALMETTO – Beautification & Landscape Committee

Florida's State Tree grace the marina boardwalk down Briny's Dock Drive & our town's center parkway. Sabal is a fan-palm native to southeastern US, Cuba and the Bahamas. They are extremely salt-tolerant and wind (hurricane) resistant. The root-ball is small and non-intrusive making them ideal for soil stabilization without damaging the marina's seawall. Professional landscapers love their versatility in both natural and stylized parks or residential landscapes. The crowns have intentionally been cut back to reduce the shock of transplanting and after stabilization the support frame will be removed. We hope you enjoy these new additions to Briny's re-palming program.

### **VOLUNTEERS NEEDED FOR TOWN OF BRINY BREEZES**

There are two openings for alternate members on our Planning & Zoning board. The P&Z Board does not meet regularly every month, but among the possible topics that may be discussed in the upcoming year might be a golf cart crossing over State Road A1A or use restrictions of Old Ocean Blvd.

The only requirement for P&Z board members is to be either a shareholder in Briny Breezes Inc. or a resident. Volunteers do not need to live here full time or be homesteaded and do not have to be registered to vote in Briny Breezes. Individuals interested in being appointed to the P&Z openings should bring proof of residency or ownership to Town Hall.

### **NOTES FROM YOUR BOARD OF DIRECTORS**

**\* Committees both Standing and Ad HOC sign up sheets are available in the office. Please sign up if you are interested in volunteering your time and expertise.**

**Voting results:** A few have asked what the outcome was from the recent annual meeting vote. Here you go:

1. Reduced reserves- to continue to reduce our reserves for the 2016 fiscal year. **Passed.**
2. Use Park Improvement Funds to replace windows and doors in the Ocean Clubhouse- **Passed**
3. Move rental restrictions from the Rules into the By-laws- **Passed**
4. This amends the By-Laws so that if it reads "Corporation" it means "Briny Breezes Inc." **Passed**
5. This sets the administrative fee for transfer of membership. **Passed**
6. This sets the passmark for Material Alterations to 51%. **Passed**
7. This raised the amount of money (\$30,000 to \$60,000) that the BOD can use annually without Shareholders' approval for Capital Expenditures and Assets. **Passed**

BBC-8 is up and running! Tune in to Channel 8001 for the scroll and broadcasts. If you still do not have the channel after pressing OK twice on 8001, call the office with your AT&T account number and we will report it.

When you are having work done on your unit, please be considerate to your surrounding neighbors, e.g. pressure washing, painting, etc. – if you are able, let them know so they can make arrangements with cars, etc. if necessary. \*If you don't clean up after projects, you risk getting a fine. Thank you.
