We left Briny as if grasped inside the tunnel of a tornado. No time for good byes. After 3 days of hospitalization, twice it was confirmed Harry had a 5 cm size malignant tumor. Dr. called it a golf

ball size, which prompted Harry to say "that is where my lost ball went.."
Hurriedly I packed the car and left with our son-in-law on Sunday. Upon arrival, Harry asked for our 2 kids and granddaughters to come to our house. Only when all were present did we inform them that Drs had told us of finding a GLIOMA malignant tumor in the brain, and their guesstimate was of about 5 weeks. The Florida Drs. prognosis was confirmed here by an Oncologist utilizing the MRI's and CAT SCANS from Bethesda East. Any intervention to the area was discouraged due to possibility of complication and risking quality of life. Briny taught us a lot and somehow we have been so prepared in our outlook to the transition from life to Gods hands. We cherish all your friendships and warm hearts at Briny. Big hugs to all those on the beach from the Tilly hat wearer, who sat under the Red Umbrella. Keep us in your prayers. Harry is in total peace and tranquility and so grateful for having met the awesome Briny family.

BEAUTIFICATION & LANDSCAPE COMMITTEE

SABAL PALMETTO – also known as a cabbage palm. The heart of the new fronds you see at the top give the tree its “cabbage” name. It can be extracted as food and tastes like other meristem tissue, such as the heart of a cabbage or artichoke. The heart can also be used to make “Heart of Palm Salads” or “Swamp Cabbage Stew, BUT – please don’t eat our palms! Extracting the heart will kill the palm. Native Americans not only cooked and ate the cabbage-like embryonic leaves but made a molasses-like syrup from the black sabal berries which was said to be not only tasty but also highly nourishing. We hope you enjoy these new additions to Briny’s re-palming program.

MANAGER NEWS

BEFORE LEAVING BRINY FOR THE SUMMER – PLEASE COMPLETE BY JUNE 1st

Please make sure to secure your home properly for hurricane season (June 1 to November 30). All patio furniture, bicycles, BBQ's, hanging items, trash cans, hoses and any miscellaneous items must be removed from the outside of units. It is not recommended to store BBQ propane tanks in or under your units. If you have a shed or Large LP gas tanks, they must be tied down securely.

Plants and Bushes: Stockholders are responsible for keeping their plants trimmed and areas weeded during the summer. All plants must be trimmed back away from the streets. Before you leave, please make arrangements to have someone take care of your landscaping.

STEPS TO CLOSING MOBILE HOMES

- 1) Take pictures of mobile home.
- 2) Forward mail and suspend newspaper delivery.
- 3) Give keys to your caretaker and the Briny Office.
- 4) Fill out emergency contact information form and return to the Briny Office and notify the office when you are leaving.
- 5) Take one Briny ID Badge with you for re-entering Briny after hurricanes.
- 6) Replace air-conditioning filters and turn off hot water switch and breaker / drain hot water heater tank.
- 7) Empty food from the refrigerator, block the door open or leave running with water only inside and put vegetable oil in garbage disposal.
- 8) Put RV antifreeze in bottom of dishwasher, washing machine and all drains.
- 9) Disconnect cable and electric from TV's and unplug all electrical items except refrigerator if left running. Disconnect telephone and answering machine and remove batteries.
- 10) Set humidistat and thermostat - turn off electric breakers except for A/C.
- 11) Put out new roach pills and powder under cabinets and drawers. Put out ant traps in kitchen.
- 12) Set out pans of kitty litter and charcoal.
- 13) Cover toilet and toilet tank with Saran Wrap to seal and clean out garbage can and place inside.
- 14) Remove batteries from TV remote, flashlights, calculator, radio and smoke detector.
- 15) Remove address books, phone books, cameras and important papers • Open all closet doors and drawers / leave clothes dryer sheets in all rooms.
- 16) Trim all bushes back - remove all seasonal flowers.
- 17) Turn off water to mobile home / remove outside handle. Disconnect and put water hose and reel inside mobile.
- 18) Clean grill and place inside mobile home, clean rain gutters and check roof for leaks.
- 19) Anchor outside storage shed (use straps over top and around the shed). Put

outside chairs inside mobile home, put flower pots under mobile home.

20) Remove all loose items and place inside home (if two strong men can't lift it - leave it) Install and lower hurricane shutters, lock all doors.
