BRINY BREEZES BUTTERFLY GARDEN

For all those that have remained and those that have gained a renewed interest in Briny's Butterfly Garden, and may wish to take one final stroll within the Garden before leaving for the season. Please be advised that over the past week there has been some major changes to the Garden in reference to much needed maintenance. The Garden includes seven or eight Santa Maria Mast Wood Trees. To the best of the membership's knowledge and records these trees were not planted by the Garden Club but were inherited as part of the border of the Garden. The problem with the trees, although they provide good shade and a good buffer to busy A1A, they are high maintenance and if left unattended can exceed up to forty to fifty feet in height and in width. They in addition to the Monkey Puzzle Tree and the Mahogany tree have been left unattended and over grown due to budgetary restrictions. The Garden Club receives no money from the corporation to help sustain the Garden. Fortunately this year we were able to add to our treasury enough money to pay for the much needed trimming of these trees. Since the trees were severely overgrown the trimming had to be quite dramatic for the welfare of the trees and the surrounding plants. It has aesthetically affected the overall look for the Garden, so please do not be shocked or surprised when entering the Garden. We assure you that by next season the trees will have begun to produce more lush foliage than ever before and by the second season one will not be able to tell they were even touched. With the drastic topping of the trees, it will enable the Garden Club to better maintain them for much less expense in the future. We appreciate your understanding and look forward to the additional growth of these trees in the very near future.

BEAUTIFICATION & LANDSCAPE COMMITTEE

Frangipani (*plumeria acuminata*) Family: Apocynaceae

This is a small deciduous tree or shrub of beautiful form, growing to 15 feet or more. This unusual tree consists of few soft, large forking branches, with a milky sap. Foliage is clustered near branch ends in alternate distribution. Spring and summer flowers are very fragrant in masses of pink, white, red, purple or salmon. The flowers have five heavy waxen petals with yellow centers. The Frangipani is a gorgeous specimen tree; slow growing, slight salt tolerant, doesn't require pruning and is propagated by cuttings. In Hawaii this flower is used for heavenly scented leis. If you stay in Briny year round, you will be rewarded by our beautiful frangipani!

TOWN NEWS VOLUNTEERS NEEDED FOR TOWN HALL

There is an opening on the Town Council for an **Alderman** to fill the vacancy created by the resignation of Ira Friedman from the Council. The Town Council has five aldermen and the mayor and meets every month year-round on the fourth Thursday of each month. Town Council members are required by law to be registered voters in the Town of Briny Breezes, but do not need to be homesteaded. Council members should be able to be present at meetings year-round, for the most part.

Individuals interested in being appointed to fill the Alderman opening should bring their Voter's Registration card to Town Hall.

There are two openings for alternate members on our **Planning & Zoning** board. The P&Z Board does not meet regularly every month, but among the possible topics that may be discussed in the upcoming year might be a golf cart crossing over State Road A1A or use restrictions of Old Ocean Blvd.

The only requirement for P&Z board members is to be either a shareholder in Briny Breezes Inc. or a resident. Volunteers do not need to live here full time or be homesteaded and do not have to be registered to vote in Briny Breezes. Individuals interested in being appointed to the P&Z openings should bring proof of residency or ownership to Town Hall.

MANAGER NEWS - MAILBOX KEYS: Many of your neighbors have installed mailbox key locks to replace the combination locks. If you are interested, you do not have to be here. You can call the office and mail in your payment of \$40.00. It's best to do it before the height of the season, otherwise there may be a delay in the installation.

SOUTH LOT: Effective immediately any boat trailer, boats, RV's, cars etc. that is left in the South Lot without a current south storage lot decal (maroon) will be towed at the owners expense.
