### **GARDEN CLUB LECTURER SERIES**

The Briny Breezes Garden Club is pleased to announce its lecturer series for the 2016/2017 Season. The first presentation will be done by Briny's own Florida Certified Master Gardner and Guest Butterfly Garden Coordinator Patti Giardalas. Patti will be discussing what to do with our plants within our gardens once arriving back at Briny. This will include pruning, fertilization etc. Her presentation will follow the Garden Club's first seasonal meeting at the West Club House on Thursday December 8<sup>th</sup> 2016.

### **KUDOS TO DISTRICT II SHAREHOLDERS**

A few weeks ago we sent out 38 letters to residents of District II who had perhaps not noticed that their place needed some repairs. In a matter of less than 20 days here is what happened: Twelve (32%) of your neighbors completed the work which included in some cases painting their homes; Nineteen (50%) presented a plan of how and/or when they expected the repairs to be completed and only seven (18%) have either done nothing or have not worked with the office to present a plan to resolution. Additionally in our District we have one unit that has already been fined \$1000.00 and we are working within our rules and the "legal channels" to not only collect that fine but to get the violations corrected. And as an FYI- all of the Districts are being reviewed. District IV is done, District III scheduled and one to be done later in the summer.

**As a district I think we should applaud ourselves.** Fifteen days is not a long time but it is what our rules currently state. March /April may not be the best time to receive such a letter but when is a good time? Our GM will be back out the end of May to check on those places where the plan indicated April for completion. If you have completed the work you might want to send her a note or e-mail so she can cross it off the list. I have received many positive comments (I prefer not to dwell on the other type.) Many, many thanks to all of you for your hard work, your cooperation and support to make District II the best ever.
