BRINY BREEZES GARDEN CLUB *Dividing your Perennial Plants*

For those that have ventured into the world of Perennial Plants it is important to know a few tips. In selecting your Perennials be sure to research the hardiness to your region. Also proper light and soil conditions, and the blooming and growth pattern. Some Perennials have very evasive root systems and can easily invade and over take the space and conditions of other less evasive Perennials. One advantage to Perennials is that the majority of Perennial plants can be divided and replanted in other areas of the garden or containers, a cost savings to the average gardener.

Ideally spring and fall are the best times to divide Perennials, however if provided with the correct after care. Perennials can be divided most any time of year, even if they are in bloom.

It is important when making that decision to divide to be sure that the plant is in good health and not in a state of decline or has not grown out of control. One wants to divide and transplant when the plant is looking at its peak. To start dig a straight edge down and around the plant, being sure to sever any roots. Then dig a little deeper down and around the plant at an angle, creating a clump of the plant and root system to be removed. With plants that have become overgrown one can reduce the size of the clump by using the same method and cutting through the center and then into quarters.

MORE GARDEN CLUB NEWS *The after care of dividing your Perennial Plants*

Once the plants are divided to the size that you are comfortably with and will fit in the area being transplanted, place the divided plants into a bucket of water for approximately one hour. In that time period take advantage of the time and replace the soil where the new plantings will be going with a combination of new soil and compost. Dig a whole adequate to contain the size of the Perennials that you are transplanting. After an hour remove the plants from the water, set the new plantings in their respective areas, again water well. Once the soil has absorbed the water proceed to cover the base of the plant with the additional new soil and compost. Again give another good watering and water frequently, preferably mid-day if not in the shade for the following week. Keep an eye on how much water is being provided by Mother Nature as this will affect the need and amount of water that you will have to provide. In a case that one is not able to replant immediately after dividing the plant, place the plants in a bucket or box and cover with damp newspaper and place in a cool area such as a garage. Keep the newspaper damp until which time planting can be done. At that point in time place the plants in a bucket of water for about an hour as discussed earlier and follow the aforementioned procedure.

HISTORICAL PRESERVATION COMMITTEE

Denton Hall, Columnist: How Did Delray Beach contribute to the cause of the Intracoastal Waterway? In 1932, the city gave the United States government an easement, or right of way, over what was then called locally the East Coast Canal. This became part of the Intracoastal Waterway which now extends from Key West to Maine. The Intracoastal was authorized by Congress in 1919, but the Florida Intracoastal, which became an important link in the national one, had been started in 1881 as a private company. By 1927, the State of Florida had authorized the transfer of the old canal to the Federal government, and efforts were made to obtain easements from the municipalities along the route. This was how Delray happened to give that right to the government in 1932. *Submitted by Dorothy McNeice*

NOTICE FROM THE TOWN OF BRINY BREEZES

If you have an irrigation system on your lot, the South Florida Water Management District wants you to be familiar with the Year Round Landscape Irrigation Rule. This rule limits landscape watering by an irrigation system to three days a week throughout Palm Beach County. No lawn and landscape irrigation should be done between 10am and 4pm or at any time on Fridays. If your unit number ends in an odd number (1, 3, 5, 7, 9) do your watering on Monday, Wednesday and Saturday. If your unit number ends in an even number (2, 4, 6, 8, 0) do your watering on Tuesday, Thursday and Sunday. New plantings may be watered for the first 30 days every day before 10am or after 4pm except Friday. No irrigation watering is allowed on Fridays. Watering your plants by hand with a container or a hose with an automatic shut-off nozzle is allowed anytime. During rainy season, don't water on days that it rains. If you have any questions, call the South Florida Water Management District 'Water Conservation Hotline' at 1-800-662-8876.
