PAINT YOUR HOME WITH FREE RECYCLED PAINT

Each year, the Solid Waste Authority of Palm Beach County provides thousands of gallons of recycled paint to residents in need of updating the exterior of their homes.

Residents of Palm Beach County can get a one-time donation of free, high-quality exterior latex house paint. To qualify for a one-time paint donation, recipients must:

- Reside in Palm Beach County
- Be single-family homeowners only
- Occupy the home they own
- Have a home up to 3,000 square feet

For help applying for the free paint, stop by Town Hall near the beauty shop or call 272-5495. If approved, paint will be available in four to six weeks. Applicants will be contacted by Solid Waste Authority when their paint is available. Palm Beach County residents who have old paint to dispose of may visit any of the Solid Waste Authority of Palm Beach County's seven Home Chemical and Recycling Centers (<http://www.swa.org/hcrc>) and drop it off for free. There are seven convenient county locations for residents to drop off their home chemicals; the 2 closest to Briny Breezes are:

- Central County Transfer Station, 1810 Lantana Road in Lantana
- South County Transfer Station, 1901 SW 4th Ave. in Delray Beach

Each year, the SWA recycles more than 120,000 lbs. of latex paint, and safely disposes of more than 1 million pounds of household hazardous waste.

CHANGE IN POLICE SERVICE

Briny Breezes Town Council is pleased to announce that the Boynton Beach Police Department was selected to provide law enforcement services for Briny Breezes with a three-year contract approved at the September 8, 2016 council meeting. As of 10/1/16, the new non-emergency police phone number is **732-8116**.

The police force will be led by Chief Jeffrey Katz as Briny Breezes Town Marshal. He will be assisted by Assistant Chief Vanessa Snow and Reserve Captain Chris Yannuzzi. Residents may contact them at katzj@bbfl.us, snowv@bbfl.us, and yannuzzic@bbfl.us. Chief Snow commented that all the officers had big smiles on their faces when they learned they'll be serving Briny Breezes again.

The Boynton Beach Police Department looks forward to sharing with Briny Breezes the many community service programs they offer. Residents who were here in 2007-2010, when Boynton Beach Police previously served Briny, talk enthusiastically about the Citizen Police Academy and the Ride-Along programs. Chief Snow mentioned a theft prevention program coming soon called Smart Water. Chief Katz announced that he will host a citizens meeting on Thursday, October 13th, at 6:30 p.m. at Palm Beach Leisureville (for complete information, please see notice on Town bulletin board).

Parking restriction enforcement is done not only by Boynton Beach police officers, but also by their Parking Enforcement Specialists. The volunteer specialists patrol weekdays during the day and can issue tickets to vehicles not displaying an appropriate decal or placard. If you, at any time, see a vehicle that you do not think belongs where it is, you should call the non-emergency number **732-8116** for enforcement.

All Council members extended their thanks and appreciation to Ocean Ridge Police Chief Hal Hutchins and the entire Ocean Ridge police force for their service to Briny residents.

MANAGER NEWS

RESIDENTS WHO HAVE ALARM SYSTEMS: Boynton Beach Communications does not monitor alarms. Anyone who may have been monitored by Ocean Ridge PD will have to hire a monitoring company. In addition, any residents or businesses that have alarm systems, will need to obtain a City of Boynton Beach Alarm Permit. This is a one-time \$30 fee. Keep in mind, since the Boynton Beach Fire/Rescue Department has been providing service for many years, many may already have a Boynton Beach permit, so there will be no change. The single permit covers burglar, fire, and/or medical alarms. Documents are available in the Briny office.

BAY DRIVE SHAREHOLDERS: Briny will be resurfacing the pavement on Bay Drive starting October 10, 2016. This project will take about two weeks, weather permitting. All Bay Drive residents received a letter with specifics regarding parking during this time. Thank you for your cooperation.

EMERGENCY PHONE NUMBER: After hour Briny emergencies, please call (561) 424-1644.

RENTAL APPLICATIONS: If you are an owner who will be renting your unit next season, don't forget to turn in your rental application as soon as possible. Don't wait until the last minute and risk inconveniencing or delaying arrival for your tenants, or having to pay a fine for a late application. Turn in your application now!

AT & T CABLE BOXES: If you sell your unit, you will need to place a disconnect order with the bulk center at (866)299-6824 and then all equipment is to be returned to any UPS facility with your AT&T account number and UPS will provide you with a receipt for returned equipment. *Equipment must be returned within 30 days to avoid charges.

ACCESS CONTROL SYSTEM: The new swipe card system is completed. You have received new cards that access the clubhouse, laundry room and community center. A letter with more information is included with the cards. These were placed in all of the Briny mailboxes in September. (Chiselers cards stay the same)
