BEAUTIFICATION & LANDSCAPE COMMITTEE

CROTON (codiaeum variegatum) family; Euporbiaceau – Crotons are considered a shrub of many varieties, growing to six feet or more. The leaves are thick and leathery and display distinct colors of green, yellow, orange, pink, red, white and crimson. Flowers appear in early spring and are small inconspicuous spikes. These plants are used in landscaping as color mass, hedge, foundation plants or specimen plants. Crotons can be pruned to prevent leggedness but wear gloves while pruning because the sap is toxic. The next time you walk to the office notice how beautiful our entrance crotons look.
