IN MEMORY

Marilyn loved snorkeling, bike riding, shell hunting and skin diving with her kids. She primarily focused on cooking, sewing and needlepoint Marilyn's favorite saying was always: "There is no place like Briny, it's my home sweet home." By personal request, she is being cremated -- as was her husband -- by the Neptune Society. In lieu of flowers, donations may be made to the Hospice of Palm Beach County.

Planting Tips

Window Boxes: Window boxes provide a visual escape for those inside while also drawing curiosity from the world outside. Use window boxes to bring life and color to hard surfaces without taking up valuable ground or floor space. If your window sills are wide enough you can place your container on them for an instant garden.

Otherwise keep in mind that window boxes can be quite heavy when soil, plants and water are added. Be sure to attach the window boxes securely with heavy duty brackets and leave some space from the house to allow for air circulation to prevent any rotting of the house. Be sure to drill drainage holes in the base for appropriate drainage.

For a formal look, keep plant placements the same in each box. However, for a more contemporary or informal look, use the same plants, in each container but shift or change their positions within each box. As always select plants appropriate for the amount of light and or shade in the given area. Consider the height in which your window plants may reach. Draping plants over the front is always an attractive and eye appealing look as well. Happy Planting.

GARDEN CLUB MAINTENANCE ON BLOOMING SHRUBS AND EVERGREENS

For those of us who have returned to our native northern territories for the summer season we should soon begin to see color from our blooming shrubs. Shrubs such as Forsythia, Azaleas, followed by Rhododendrons, Lilacs, Hibiscus, Gardenias etc. Depending on where you are located as to what blooming shrubs are native to your area.

A few things that we tend to overlook with regards to our blooming plants that surround our homes are; number one fertilizer. Check with your local nursery as to what fertilizers are best to use on the varieties of plants that are in your yard. For maximum blooms some plants require more acidity, some more PH, Calcium etc.

Another thing we often neglect is the proper timing in pruning these plants that may affect the number of blooms that the plant will produce the following year. The best time for pruning any of our blooming species is shortly after they have bloomed and before any new growth becomes evident. For example, if your blooming shrub blooms in May and the blooms have passed within a week or two that would be the best time to prune your shrub. Pruning in mid-summer or fall before heading back to Briny will affect the number of blossoms for the following season as the pollination process has already occurred and the buds for the following blooming season have already been established and we would be pruning those future blossoms from the shrub.

NEWS FROM YOUR BOARD PRESIDENT

Well most of our seasonal residents are away, Briny gets quieter each day... The turtles are laying eggs on the beach, the heat and humidity are back and the craziness of summer improvements is underway by our very dedicated staff.

Going to quickly address some "hot topics" beach hut, flooding and ocean ropes...

Shareholders want to know why the beach hut is still there when we voted it be removed. The roof and walls have all been removed. What remains are the large posts that were driven into the sand to support the roof and walls, the decking and the railings. To make a long story VERY SHORT, we need a PERMIT to remove the structure. In order to get a permit, the EPA must grant us permission to work on the dune. The EPA will not allow the large posts that were driven into the dune to be removed as it is turtle season. So we were left with 2 options, 1. To remove the decking and the rails which would cause these very large posts to be very unstable and unsafe, surround the structure with lots of caution tape and/or safety fencing (a real eyesore) and wait till the community votes, OR 2. We can leave the decking and the supporting rails/beams and avoid potential safety issues. Once the shareholders vote in February, the structure will either be put back together in its entirety or completely removed, prior to turtle season. At this time the structure will stay as it currently is, no walls or roof, but secure decking, stairs, railings and framing.

Let's move on to FLOODING... we just this last week had our BLUE FULL MOON, one of the catalysts to extreme high tides, this also coincided with several days of very heavy rain storms. During the storm there was definitely flooding, higher than we have seen in the past, BUT within about an hour of the storm stopping, there was VERY minimal flood water. Our new pumps and catch basins are doing their job. There is NO WAY to eliminate flooding when the ground is saturated, the tides are high and we get record amounts of rain. PLEASE understand that all of our efforts are to BEST deal with removing the water from our streets in the shortest time possible. Unless we raise the entire property significantly, there is no way to avoid rain flooding. It is happening in Delray, Ocean Ridge, Manalapan and most other coastal communities, this is NOT a Briny only problem. On that note, residents MUST do what is necessary to MITIGATE their own damages from flooding. Raise your belongings as necessary, in many areas it is no longer feasible to store items under our units, and in some cases residents are choosing to RAISE their units. This can be done and should be considered if you are in very low lying areas. The corporation can only do so much. We all must take responsibility for our own units and do what is necessary to avoid damages.

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Ocean Ropes... Well I wrote a LOT about this in the last bugle and there are not too many other updates at this point. The EPA has not committed to a permit for the ropes and has asked for more information. Theresa is currently working on providing this to see if we even have the ability to try moving this forward and requesting the "ocean lease" from the government. This item may have to wait until we are able to establish a committee in the fall. It appears that in order to even try for this approval, it is going to be a very expensive and very, very time consuming situation. Our manager and office staff cannot spend the entire summer trying to get a lease approved and ropes installed. There are 200 other things that also need to be done and working on, many that are more important to the daily workings of our community. IF you wish to volunteer your time to chair the ROPES committee, please email or call Theresa. Our new clubhouse windows and doors will be coming in June and shortly after, the entire clubhouse exterior will be repainted which we are very excited about. I will keep you updated thru the summer Bugle's on all that's going on in Briny.

HISTORICAL PRESERVATION COMMITTEE

'Turtles, Turtles, Turtles' by Edward G. Hillery, Jr. (Originally submitted March 2004)

It's that time of the year again! The time that our old friends from the sea grace us with their annual presence. No, I'm not talking about hurricanes or sea lice, I am talking turtles.

The turtle season takes place between the 1st of March and the 31st of October. During this period, lights that are capable of being seen from the beach below the dune should be directed away from the beach or should be shielded so as not to cast their light on the beach. The minimum amount of lights should be left on. Naturally, safety issues caused by inadequate lighting should be avoided. The lighting controls are in effect from sun down to sun up.

Here in Ocean Ridge the town has been working with Florida Power & Light in testing a new filtered light designed specifically for producing a light that will not impact the newly hatched turtles. You may have seen them along Old Ocean Blvd. They appear to cast a gold colored light. You may have noticed the shields that the County has placed on their lights in the area of the Inlet. Everyone is doing what they can to assist nature with maintaining a healthy environment for the new turtles. And remember, it's a crime to remove eggs from a nest.
