IMPORTANT NOTICE from GENERAL MANAGERS OFFICE

PLEASE note that the safety of Briny Residents is a top priority for your board and this office. We have repeatedly been advised that emergency vehicles will NOT drive down Briny roads if the proper clearance is not available.

We have many shareholders who are not adhering to the rules requiring landscaping, shrubbery, trees, etc. to be a minimum of 6 inches from the road/pavement.

In sections 1, 2 and parts of 3, this makes our roadways too narrow. And yes we have had emergency vehicles refuse to drive down our roads to get to a resident in need.

PLEASE accept this as notice to remove, cut back, trim etc. Any and all trees, shrubs, branches, plants, statues, garden gnomes etc. anything that may be 6 inches or less from the edge of the road/pavement.

ON or shortly after April 1st, 2015, we will begin removing any items that violate this space and the shareholder will be billed accordingly.

BECAUSE of the serious nature of this request/violation, this is the one and only notice so please comply.

If a shareholder needs an ambulance, we wouldn't want them to have to wait while they park at the end of a street and walk down to the unit because bushes, trees or even garden gnomes were in the way of their required access.

Please contact the office or any board member with questions.

Rule B.5, d.) Landscaping on individual stockholder's assigned lots is the financial responsibility of each stockholder. This includes planting of shrubs, trees, flowers and lawns and the cost of removal of such items and includes tree trimming beyond the capability of normal ground tree trimming. Management has the authority to remove or trim any trees or other plantings that may eventually reach a size or height that blocks the view or restricts the free circulation of light and air passage. All shrubbery on streets must be kept trimmed back to a minimum of six (6) inches from the pavement. No trees or shrubs are allowed to be touching adjacent units. Any trimming or removal required to be accomplished by Park personnel will be charged to that individual stockholder. . No trees are to be planted or removed without Board approval.

January 30 – Trailerite housewives who keep a tight budget say a couple can live here for \$150 a month. This wouldn't include night clubbing at Miami Beach or shopping in Palm Beach, but it covers rent, electricity bills, groceries and gasoline. It provides for a leisurely comfortable life of fishing, bathing, card playing and shuffleboard. More important, it pays for an escape from the rigors of a northern winter. The cost of trailer life, of course, includes a substantial investment. Trailers with modern conveniences range from \$1,500 to \$7,500 new. There's a wide selection on the market. 53 makers belong to the Trailer Coach Manufacturer's Association. Used trailers are also available in Chicago and Florida dealerships.
