TOWN OF BRINY BREEZES NEWS

A number of residents in Briny Breezes are installing flagpoles and displaying the American flag. In support of this enthusiastic patriotism, please be aware of the federal law pertaining to displaying the U.S. flag.

INFORMATION FROM THE U.S. FLAG CODE

- The flag should be displayed only between sunrise and sunset, although the Flag Code permits night-time display "when a patriotic effect is desired" and the flag is illuminated. Similarly, the flag should be displayed only when the weather is fair, except when an all-weather flag is displayed.
- The flag should be raised briskly and lowered slowly and ceremoniously.
- When the flag is lowered, no part of it should touch the ground or any other object; it should be received by waiting hands and arms. To store the flag it should be folded neatly and ceremoniously.
- The flag should be cleaned and mended when necessary.
- When a flag is so tattered that it no longer fits to serve as a symbol of the United States, it should be destroyed in a dignified manner, preferably by burning. The Veterans of Foreign Wars, American Legion, Boy Scouts of America, the military and other organizations regularly conduct dignified flag-burning ceremonies.
- No other flag should be placed above it. The flag of the United States is always the first flag raised and the last to be lowered.

INFORMATION ON BUILDING PERMITS

- The installation of a new spot light or flood light would require a building permit for electrical work.

The Palm Beach County Library's bookmobile is adding the Town of Briny Breezes as one of their stops starting in May. They will be in Briny Breezes on alternate Fridays starting May 8th. The bookmobile makes the entire collection of the Palm Beach County Library available. There have been an amazing number of books borrowed from Briny's library this season, and the bookmobile will open up even more possibilities.

The bookmobile will make its first stop on Friday, May 8th, from 1:45 to 2:15 p.m. and it will return to Briny every two weeks.

The library measures the need for the bookmobile based on the number of items checked out, so check out as many as you want, even if you aren't sure if you'll be able to read them all. The bookmobile arrives chock full of books, including new releases, but you can also make special requests. The librarians will search the whole library system and bring the books when they come back.

If you do not have a library card for the Palm Beach County library system, the bookmobile librarians will help you get one in a snap, just bring your driver's license.

'Tenants Will Buy Briny Breeze Park – Group has \$1 Million on Deposit'

A \$1,400,000 deal which will transfer ownership of Briny Breezes Trailer Park to tenants was nearing completion here this week. A committee of 34 park residents has 'sold' 335 of the parks 550 lots and has \$1,000,000 in cash held in escrow in a local bank.

The committee, headed by Bert Aiken, is serving without compensation of any kind. They have until August to raise the remaining \$400,000 cash it will take to close the deal.

Plans are for cooperative ownership and operation of the huge park, the fifth largest in the state. The prospective owners plan to build a swimming pool and an emergency first aid station to be in operation next season. Long range plans include a grocery store, a doctor and a dentist.

This 43 acre oceanfront development is owned by the Miller estate, with Paul Miller as trustee and park manager. Facilities include a yacht basin, three marine slips and a 600 seat auditorium. Originally, the land was a dairy pasture. At Briny Breezes, plans are for the operation of the park to be in the hands of a seven man board, elected annually from the stockholder-directors.
